

Sister Nathalie Becquart XMCJ is a French religious sister with the Congregation of Xavières. In May 2019 Pope Francis appointed her Consultor to the Synod of Bishops, and in 2021 as the Undersecretary of the Synod of Bishops, making her the first woman to hold this position in the Vatican and first woman to be granted voting rights in the Synod of Bishops. Sr Nathalie made significant contributions to both the Synod on Young People in 2018 and the



The Nativity of The Lord (Christmas)

Dear brothers and sisters in

Child Jesus.

May I wish you all a graceful Christmas and the true joy of finding the Baby Jesus among us. We know that the real reason for our joy is that 'God is with us'.



This God-Child is a Divine Gift in

human hands. We don't get to see him except in one another. It is so sad that often this divine-human baby is neglected and forgotten amidst our celebrations. Sometimes we celebrate his birthday without even having thought about him.

It is said that once Jesus, though uninvited, took a chance to attend his own Birthday party, Christmas, after all it was in his honour. He knocked on the door of the party hall, but seeing him poorly dressed, they shut the door on his face. Any of us may do the same unknowingly. And Jesus waited out side for a very long time and walked away. God does not seem to want any consideration that an ordinary human person may be denied.

That was how, 2022 years ago the inn keeper missed the God—man, who would have been born in his inn. He lost the opportunity, probably not because there was no room to accommodate them, but because Joseph and Mary were poor. In fact his heart had no room.

More than Mary and Joseph it was Almighty God seeking a place to take birth. God being Almighty He could have under minded the inn keeper. God could have got the whole inn emptied for himself. First of all because everything and everyone belongs to Him, for, He is the creator. Even the whole town could have been emptied for the same reason. But God minds us. He seeks our consent. He is not a God who dashes into our lives. He gives us freedom to say yes or no. He would keep knocking until we open the door for him.

Mary and Joseph do not argue or bargain with the inn keeper, nor are they insisting. But, they walk away in utter helplessness, into the cold dark night. We will never understand the depth of sorrow they felt as they walk away from the inn. Their face cast down. A sense of shame and guilt may have filled the heart of Joseph. In spite of being made the care taker, he could not find a place for Mary to give birth to her Child. Drops of tears rolled down the cheeks of Mary too, even as she tried to console Joseph.

Soon they were to find a place, a place not fit for human beings. There were human being anyway. There wasn't any room, yet the shepherds made sufficient space for their guests. They were more than happy to have them. Open hearted, so warm and friendly. Even the cattle moved to give Mary sufficient space to give birth to her baby Jesus. God was happy to be born among hearts so warm. What the inn keeper lost for all eternity, the poor shepherds gained. Soon they hear the angels sing, Glory to God in the highest heaven and peace to people of goodwill on earth.

God comes to all of us knocking on the doors of our hearts. Let's be people of goodwill. He comes to us for our sake, to save us from eternal pain. Let's see him in everyone and invite Him into our joys and sorrows. Let's invite Him into our every celebration into every moment of our lives. May the New Born Baby Jesus fill your lives with True Joy.
