Feast of the Most Holy Family

The Feast of the Holy Family challenges us to consider our own families,



both the ones in which we grew up and the ones of which we are now a part.

"It raises questions in us about the harmony of the home we're in now — and what part we play in both its peace and its disturbance. ...

We must ask ourselves if we are learning from one another, caring for one another, becoming more spiritual together as we go.

And if not, why not? And what do we intend to do about it, as Jesus did, for the sake of the rest of the world?"

Amid today's important and ongoing debates about the definitions and nature of marriage and family, this Feast reminds us of the true vocation of the family: to foster the faith of each of its members and to support them in their search for God and God's will for them.

Before we move on, let's take a moment to reflect on this passing year

The Holy Family, Year B

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus.

Christmas time is family time. Christmas reunites families. I believe, this Christmas too has brought many families together; The Catholic Church has chosen to celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Family during the Christmas Time, because this Feast naturally fits in to this Season.



We call the family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph "holy", because theirs was the holiest of all families ever. Their holiness was based on their relationship with God, and it was expressed in their love and care for each other.

Joseph was holy. He protected Mary from being stoned to death. In protecting their Child Joseph fled with them to Egypt. Joseph earned the livelihood for the family by his hard work and was most sincere. Joseph always sought the Will of God, and was open to the plan of God. He always worshiped and adored Jesus as God. He was a praying person.

Mary was holy. She gladly supported Joseph in his struggles. Her holiness can also be seen in the way she took utmost care of her Baby. She was immaculately conceived, so she did not have original sin, nor any personal sin. Even from her childhood days she had dedicated herself to God and said 'yes' to God's plan of Salvation for us.

The holiness of their Son Jesus goes without saying. He is the Most Holy God Himself.

Each of the three persons cared about the other two and stood by them: a perfect model for every family. Each person of the Holy Family considered the other two, more important than oneself. Usually, the order in which we mention the members of any family is, first the parents then their children. But in the case of the Holy Family the order is reversed, instead of "Joseph, Mary and Jesus", it is "Jesus, Mary and Joseph."

Jesus, being God himself, could have considered himself the head of the Holy Family. Mary, being the "Mother of God", could have considered Joseph less important than herself. Yet Jesus and Mary never considered Joseph as the least important person. He was respected by them as the head of the Holy Family.

The Holy Family is a model for all families because, despite their many difficulties, the Family remained faithful, loving and united and submitted themselves to God. The Holy Family is not only a model for all other families; it is also the source of blessings.



The life of Jesus begins with Mary. Therefore, it is appropriate that we begin the New Year with a Feast of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. Today's special feast affirms that the Blessed Virgin Mary is truly the Mother of God. This Catholic Dogma finds its origin from the passage

found in the Gospel of Luke. After the Archangel Gabriel appeared to Mary, she went to visit her cousin Elizabeth. Upon her arrival, Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit expressed her joy and exclaimed, "How is it that the Mother of my Lord should come to me?"

In 431 A.D, the Council of Ephesus affirmed that Mary is truly the Mother of God because "according to the flesh" she gave birth to Jesus, who is truly God. So, on this New Year Day, let us turn to Mary, our mother, with all our prayers and hopes, confident that she will never fail us and give us "A MEANINGFUL NEW YEAR!"
