
# 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A Commandments

No one likes to be commanded to do this or to do that; and not to do this and not to do that. Everyone wants to be free to do or not to do anything as and when one pleases. That is why we have the words of request 'please', 'kindly' etc. In other words we do not like to be dictated. We want to do things in our own freedom and personal choice.



In today's Gospel Jesus reminded us of the Ten Commandments. They are not requests but "Commandments". The words 'please, kindly etc are not in these Commandments; rather we find in them the words 'you shall' and 'you shall not'. As a result very many people are not happy with these Commandments.

How important are the Ten Commandments to our lives? They are as important as the legs are to a chair or to a table. If the Commandments of God can be compared to a leg of a chair then what are the other three legs?



The four legs can be compared to 1) The Creed we proclaim 2) The Sacraments we celebrate 3) The Devotions & the Prayers we pray 4) The Commandments we practice. All four legs are equally important.

Even so, there are people who say that the Ten Commandments are outdated; they are too old to be valid anymore; or that the Commandments are from the Old Testament times, therefore not applicable to the New Testament times etc. But we know that, the Ten Commandments together with the whole Word of God is true for ever. They can never be outdated or be invalid.

Again we the humans are not the ones to decide as to what is right and what is wrong. The creator God himself has decided the right and the wrong. It is good to know also that these Commandments of God do not take away our freedom. In fact they guide our freedom in the right direction. True freedom is "to be able to do the right and to avoid the evil".

Again the Ten Commandments are expressions of God's Love for us. Because he loves us, he has given us these Commandments. And because the Commandments are born out of God's love for us, let us practice the commandments out of our love for God. The more we love God the more we love to follow his Commandments, and love serve one another.

8 year-old Johnny goes to a supermarket and picks a box of laundry detergent. The grocer walks over and asks Johnny if he had a lot of laundry to do. Johnny says "I'm going to wash my dog". "But you shouldn't use this to wash your dog," says the grocer. "It's very powerful and if you wash your dog in this, it might even kill him." But Johnny ignores the grocer's advise and pays for the detergent and goes home.



A week later Johnny is back in the store to buy some candies. The grocer recognises him and asks "How did your dog wash go? "Oh, he died," says Johnny. The grocer says "I tried to tell you not to use that detergent on your dog". "Well", Johnny replies, "I don't think it was the detergent that killed him" "Oh What was it then?" "I think it must have been the rinse or the spin".
