

World Day of Prayer Friday 3 March, 10.30—11.30am



7th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A Love your Enemy

Dear friends in Christ, Many years ago someone said to me, 'I'm ready to go to hell, but will not ever forgive so and so who hit and wounded me'. I knew who that person was talking about, and I knew that the incident occurred more than a year before. Meanwhile, the wound



had already been healed; and so, I thought that it was a forgotten incident. But after hearing about it again, I realised that the person's feelings of hurt and anger were still fresh.

Maybe, if I were in that person's place, I too would have reacted the same way. I was just reminded of it by today's gospel which says about loving one's enemies. Loving one's enemies necessarily involves forgiving and reconciling. To cherish unforgiving attitudes is not Christian. Even in the Old Testament we read, "Thou shalt not avenge, nor bear any grudge against anybody". Vengeance and bearing grudges are ungodly qualities".

Elsewhere in the Old Testament, it is also said that hating one's enemy is alright'. There are also other religious scriptures and religions which advocate hatred and vengeance. According to some religions vengeance is a must. Such an understanding is so un-Christian and totally unacceptable to us. Grudge and retaliation, even to its slightest degree is not welcome. On the contrary, as followers of Christ we are called to love and pray for the person who persecutes or harms us in any way.

Just like there are many examples of unforgiving people, there are also many examples of forgiving people. One of the many examples is that of Sister Rani Maria, who used to be a well known social worker in India. One day as she was travelling by bus, she was stabbed to death. Naturally there were reactions by the Christians, who took out processions and agitated and demanded justice. And eventually the murderer was jailed. But the family members of Sr Rani Maria visited him in the prison and forgave him. They requested the authorities that the man maybe pardoned and released. This big gesture of forgiveness opened the eyes not only of the murderer, but millions of people who believe in vengeance. They were also deeply touched. Later, when the murderer was released, he visited the family members of Sr Rani Maria, asked for pardon and became their family friend. He also attended Charismatic retreats with them, and now he is a well-known witness to Christ.

We may not have had such incidents in our lives that we too express our willingness to forgive and be friends again. But surely in the lives of each and every one of us there must have been at-least small incidents when we could have shown Christ-like forgiveness; "Father, forgive them for they do not know what they are doing".

Even according to the medical science, unforgiven incidents have negative impact on our physical and emotional wellbeing; and according to Jesus it has a negative impact on our spiritual wellbeing as well. The greatest of the examples of a forgiving person is Jesus himself, who died for us even when we were still sinners. As followers of Jesus let us follow his example and forgive each and every one who may have hurt us in any way, even to the highest or least degree. Most of all let's pray for them.
