

1st Sunday of Lent Year A Temptations of Jesus

Dear friends in Christ,

In the beginning of St Matthew's Gospel we are told that the angel appeared to Mary and said, her child would be called 'Immanuel', meaning "God with us". And throughout his gospel St Mathew tries to explain



how, in the person of Jesus, God is truly with us. Even at the end of Mathew's gospel as Jesus ascends into heaven, Jesus promised to be with us until the end of time.

The Gospel passage on the Temptations of Jesus can also be understood in the light of the theme 'God with us'. Here Jesus is being tempted by Satan to stop being with us. Satan is trying to cut off Jesus' relationship with God and people. He is suggesting to Jesus that Jesus should do everything by himself and for himself; stop being the Immanuel.

All the three temptations are really about that. It is not about stones and bread; it is not about jumping down from temple-top and being rescued; it is not about worshipping the devil and owning all the kingdoms. Rather it is about leading a life without God. It is about going it all alone, it is about trying keeping Jesus away from his Father and from us.


All of us have an urge inside us which says, "Why don't you go it alone? Why not chuck the God out of your life altogether. Who really needs him? Be yourself.

In the case of Adam and Eve too, their problem was not about eating an apple. It was the little voice inside them that said "You can be like God...You don't need to settle for just being with him. Break off the submissive relationship with God. Claim your autonomy. God is in your way. Get him out of the way. And eventually Adam and Eve gave in to that trap of Satan and fell.

In our case too, we easily give in to similar treacherous suggestions of satan and sin. But in the case of Jesus when he was tempted to be all by himself and for himself, he did not give in to satan. He stood with his Father and with us. Jesus proved himself true to his name, Immanuel. God is with us.

Suppose, Jesus had given in!!! Suppose he yielded to the temptations and sinned, then it would have brought about for us unimaginable consequences. What would have been our fate then? But Jesus chose to stay close to his Father, and he chose to continue to be God with us. He did not forsake his Father; and he did not forsake His people.

Not even for a moment would he choose to give us up. Jesus is with us even in the most vulnerable moments of our lives. If we are tempted he is tempted too; If we are hungry, he is hungry too; If we are wounded, he is wounded too; If we are humiliated, rejected, hated and troubled, then he has experienced all these and more. The only difference is that we give into temptations and sin, but Jesus overcame all temptations and never ever sinned.



Therefore even in our most hopeless situations, we can learn to trust in his unseen but sure companionship. He is always there with us even when we cannot feel him. We can learn to live by every word that comes from the mouth of Our Lord, who says, 'I am with you always'.

During this season of Lent let us make an extra effort to be with Jesus, to stand by him, to live for him, just as he suffers to be with us.

Keep yourself close to the Lord!
