



CATHOLIC ARCHDIOCESE OF MELBOURNE

Dear Father,

I convey to you the sad news that Reverend Monsignor Gerard James Diamond M.A. (Oxon), D.Theol., L.S.S., PE died at Cabrini Hospital, Malvern this morning, 10 January 2024. He was aged 81 years.

"O God, listen favourably to our prayers offered on behalf of your servant and priest, and grant that Gerard, who committed himself zealously to the service of your name, may rejoice forever in the company of your saints. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen"

Monsignor Diamond served the Church in a very positive and pastorally enriching manner, giving fine example to both his brother priests and the community for over 56 years. The Archdiocese is most grateful for his gentle, kind and unassuming service to the Church of Melbourne.

After his Ordination on 22 July 1967, Father Diamond served as Assistant Priest at the parishes of Eltham (1967); Ferntree Gully (1968); Glen Huntly (1969) and Oakleigh (1970). In 1970, Father Diamond went to Oxford to study oriental languages and to qualify for a Licence in Scripture at the Pontifical Biblicum Institute in Rome. Upon his return to Melbourne in 1974, he was appointed Assistant Priest at Jordanville Parish before taking up an appointment in 1975 as Moderator at Corpus Christi College, Clayton. In 1977, Father Diamond was appointed a Censor of books for the Archdiocese of Melbourne. He was Master of Catholic Theological College from 1977 to 1983 and in October 1983, returned to Rome for doctoral studies in Sacred Scripture at the Biblicum. After four years, Father Diamond completed a Doctorate in Theology at the Melbourne College of Divinity. He held a brief appointment as Assistant Priest again at Glen Huntly (1988) and then became Parish Priest in 1992 - a role he held for over 25 years. Along with this appointment, in 2003, Father Diamond was appointed Parish Priest of Caulfield Parish. Upon his retirement, Monsignor Diamond was appointed Pastor Emeritus on 10 January 2018.

On 9 May 2012, Pope Benedict nominated Father Diamond as a Chaplain of His Holiness, in recognition of his leadership as Master of Catholic Theological College and was thus given the title of 'Monsignor'.

As a man of study and learning, Monsignor Diamond's special gifts and talents will be greatly missed.

May he rest in peace.

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time: Year B: \"BEHOLD THE LAMB OF GOD"

The theme "Jesus, the Lamb of God" is part and parcel of our Christian Faith. John the Baptist as he was pointing out Jesus to his disciples said, "behold the Lamb of God." He did not say, behold a miracle worker; nor did he say, behold the good shepherd; nor 'behold the King of kings'. We know and John too knew that Jesus is all these and more, yet John the Baptist chose the very best description for Jesus and said "Behold the Lamb of God."



This title for Jesus is not an invention by John the Baptist. We can see it mentioned right from the first book of the Bible to it's last book, from Genesis to Revelation. From the beginning of creation right up to the very end of the world and even beyond.

In Genesis, Abel offered God an acceptable offering that was of a Lamb. Again in Genesis itself, when Abraham was about to sacrifice his son Isaac, suddenly God's voice was heard saying 'not your son, but I will send my Son to be sacrificed.' and then shows a lamb to represent God's only begotten son and asks Abraham to sacrifice that lamb instead. In the book of Exodus, in Moses' time at Passover the Pascal Lamb that the Israelites were to slain and eat prefigured Jesus, the Lamb of God.

Not only throughout the Biblical history can we see Jesus as the Lamb of God, but in his own life here on earth we see lambs representing Jesus. A legend says that at Jesus' birth one of the lambs at the manger was also given the name 'Jesus.' We are also familiar with the images of Mother Mary holding Baby Jesus as well as a Lamb in her arms; meaning that the Baby is meant to be the "Lamb of Sacrifice". We also see images of Jesus as the Good Shepherd carrying lambs on his shoulders.

Some paintings of the Last Supper shows a lamb in place of Jesus at the table. Some other paintings have a lamb slain together with the figure of Jesus on the Cross. Even the Risen Lord is often represented by the image of a lamb holding a victorious flag.

The last book of the Bible, the Revelation speaks of Jesus as the Lamb 29 times. He is shown as the slain Lamb the only one found worthy to open the scroll and read it. In sacred art, the image of "Lamb of God' is seen on stained glass windows, on altar cloths, on the host to be consecrated, on medals etc,

An apparition on a church wall, at Knock in Ireland on 21 August1879 includes an image of Jesus as the Lamb, shown on altar, shown in place of the Tabernacle, right in the centre.

When John says, "Behold!", He is asking us to accept Jesus, to receive Jesus and to follow Jesus, for Jesus is the True Lamb of God'

Lamb of God, have mercy on us.
