
Guidelines during the Current COVID Restrictions.

Updated on 15 Jan. 2021

Glen Huntly Parish requests all our church attendees to observe the following guidelines.

- ◆ Despite your prior registration, arrive at least 15 minutes before Mass time, to ensure adequate checking in. In the last 10 minutes seats may be allocated to earlier arrivals.
- ◆ Church doors will be closed once the maximum number of 120 people are in.
- ◆ To enter and to exit the church, please use the Front Entrance only.
(The side-doors may be left open for ventilation purpose).
- ◆ If you are feeling unwell please get tested and stay at home.
- ◆ On arrival at the church-foyer all must sanitize their hands.
- ◆ All must wear face masks in the church. (Not mandatory from Monday, 18 Jan.2021)
- ◆ Once inside the Church, follow the signage.
- ◆ All attendees must register their contact details using any of the following means:
 1. Manual registration. (the next 2 options are preferred)
 2. QR Code. (and confirm it with the Registration Volunteer)
 3. trybooking. (and tick off your names in the trybooking list at the foyer)
- ◆ On Weekends, please make your offerings at the church door before or after Mass.
- ◆ All must try to keep 1.5 meter distance from each other at all times.
- ◆ Please sit facing the yellow labels on pews.
- ◆ All must sanitise their hands before receiving Holy Communion.
- ◆ Holy Communion on the tongue is permitted. They must come last in the queue.
- ◆ As you proceed to receive Holy Communion follow the floor markings .
- ◆ Holy Communion will be distributed in the following order:
First, the musicians, the singers and the congregation on school-side of the church.
Second, the congregation on the Grange Rd side of the church.

**If possible please give a helping hand in sanitizing the church after the Mass.

Tony's Café Parish Outreach Final Report for 2020.

Thank you to all who have helped in all different ways during this difficult year. With your practical help and prayerful support, and with financial help from Glen Eira Council we were able to remain open on Tuesdays and Thursdays and to add an extra day, a Saturday barbeque.

When the lockdown started, City of Glen Eira made available COVID 19 Community Grants and encouraged us to apply. With their grants of \$10,000 for food and \$4,998 for take away containers, and with a donated barbeque and pergola from Bunnings, we managed. Many local support agencies had closed so numbers jumped from serving just over 100 meals on Tuesday and Thursdays in March, to just over 350 meals in December.

As you can imagine, our costs increased. Some weeks we spent \$500 a week on meat alone. We received wonderful support from OzHarvest and Foodbank Victoria. Father Pritchard continued to honour our agreement to provide the facilities and utilities, but under the terms of this agreement the Café promised to be financially independent and so we have never asked for or used parish funds. Usually we manage our finances with a combination of fundraising and a community grant from Council: with the lockdown our fundraising capacity became non-existent.

But God works in mysterious and unexpected ways. A team of 10 parishioners kept us supplied with homemade cake to use as desserts. A Carnegie café owner regularly sent fresh vegetables and boxes of take away containers. Bread was donated twice-weekly. Parishioners dropped in with masks and local schools donated toiletries and food in a big way. A restaurant in Elsternwick gave us a whole meal. And the volunteers just kept on coming. Our guests repeatedly ask us to pass on their thanks to you all for your help.

Moving forward, as we have already spent the Council money on food and containers we are applying for another grant, because, instead of having a break in January, we are open on Tuesdays for a hot take away lunch and a food parcel. So please pray that we get this one too.

Thank you all so much for having faith in Tony's Café's ability to reach those who are in need especially the families and those who are alone. The stories we are hearing are very sad, but we believe that God has had His hand on Tony's Café for the past 12 years and we are sure that He is not going to take it away in these difficult pandemic days. We just have to keep on trying to do our best. Thank you for your kindness, love and help to those whom you do not know. They are very grateful. May God bless you all. In February we will reopen fully.
