St Anthony's Christmas Day Dinner 2021 Report

We would like to thank everyone who contributed in so many ways to make our 29th Annual Christmas Day Dinner such a success. This was our second COVID year and although we would all agree that sitting down to a Christmas Dinner is much nicer than getting a take away bag, the guests were delighted that the dinner was on and they enjoyed it in different ways.

The coming together, meeting up with other guests and volunteers showed the friendships that have grown up over the last 29 years. The happiness was tangible. Some people took their meal home and ate it alone in front of the TV. Others took an extra meal and ate it with their neighbour. Others gathered in the park to celebrate with their "Christmas family", the people they have met at St. Anthony's Christmas Dinner over the years. Some families took their meal home and celebrated together. All of this would not have been possible without your help. Over 119 of you helped in some way to contribute to the Dinner for those who otherwise would not have been celebrating the great season of Christ's birth, the One who was to come and teach us how to love one another, be they family, friend or stranger, but that we are all one family.

Firstly we would like to thank the 94 people who prayed for the success of the dinner. God surely heard your wonderful prayers which moved many hearts in many ways to make the dinner such a success. Thank you also to the 119 people who donated money, goods and helped set up the hall, or helped on the day, smiling and in good humour cooking, serving, for each of the 283 guests handing out the meal, a box of Christmas sweets, drinks and other provisions plus a bag of lollies for each of the 31 children.

Our wonderful drivers delivered 51 meals to people who were unable to come to the hall, they were very happy to see them and receive the Dinner and the extras with a friendly face wishing them a Merry Christmas. One lady was so excited that she kept saying Shabat Shalom, Shabat Shalom all the while shaking the drivers hand. We are not sure if she was Jewish or she thought we were Jewish, but she was certainly excited and couldn't stop smiling, it made the driver's day. The total number of meals you donated to or helped prepare and give out was 314, fantastic, it was a record number of people you helped to celebrate Christmas.

As of last year the meal changed slightly as we could not take a chance having prawns on such a hot day. However, everyone was delighted to receive their meal consisting of:

- Entrée: Canteloupe and shaved ham
- Mains: Roast turkey and ham, roast potatoes and pumpkin, cauliflower in white sauce, carrots and peas served with gravy and cranberry sauce.
- Dessert: Plum Pudding, with custard, cream and an ice cream Dixie. For the children there was an ice cream Dixie with topping or sprinkles.

The day was outstanding in revealing the friendliness, good will and happiness shown by all the workers and guests which showed that when we all pull together great things can happen and a great sense of wellbeing is felt by everyone. Many of the guests have asked us to pass on their thanks to all of you who contributed to the dinner. You all surpassed yourselves in showing your love for your fellow man. On the occasion of the Feast of St. Blasé, our throats are blessed with two candles that are blessed on the previous day.


Feast of St. Vincent Pallotti

We celebrate the feast of St. Vincent Pallotti this weekend in the simplest manner. The Mass together with the Readings will be of the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time Year C (no change)

On this occasion of the Feast of St. Pallotti we shall also take up a Special Collection for the Pallottine-run orphanage in Keshero, Congo, Africa.

The Feast of St. Vincent Pallotti occurs each year on 22 January.

St. Vincent Pallotti is the founder of the Religious Congregation called 'The Society of the Catholic Apostolate' (SAC), popularly known as the Pallottines. Fr. Leenus is a member of the Pallottines.
