



#### Feast of the Presentation of Our Lord Friday 2 February

This feast has many different names in the Roman Catholic Church. It has been called the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, the Feast of the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary and more familiarly, Candlemas.

It is officially called the Presentation of the Lord, commemorating the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple. While at the Temple, an old man named Simeon said, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples, a light for the revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory for your people Israel".

Simeon declared that Jesus would be a "light," and the Church developed a custom of lighting and blessing of candles on this day.

Though not a holy day of obligation, it is a beautiful day in the Church's calendar, one that signals the end of the "Christmas-Cycle" and looks forward to the light that will shatter all darkness at the Easter Vigil when another candlelight service is performed in recognition that, "the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen".

# Jesus has all Authority and Power!



Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

The authority and power that Jesus holds is unlimited and unparalleled. This does not surprise us, because we know that Jesus is God himself. The God, who by his mere word, created the heavens, the earth and all in it, could do anything and everything even as he walked among us as a human person.

But the people of Jesus' time, 2000 years ago, did not really know him to be God. Therefore, they were wonderstruck at the authoritative words and deeds of Jesus. It was okay for them to be surprised, or even to disbelieve. But we, who know Jesus to be the almighty God, have no excuse if we disbelieve, do not trust or even if we are surprised at Jesus words and deeds.

Surprisingly, there are people who rely more on the evil one than on God; thinking that the evil one is more powerful than God himself. We need to remind ourselves that Jesus' authority and power are unparalleled. In the Gospel of today, we are given the image of Jesus teaching in the synagogue. Many people who listened to Jesus became aware that there was something special and unique about him. This awareness gradually led many of them to full belief in Jesus and accordingly refused to be influenced by the evil one.

Jesus exercised his authority and power in the most loving and caring way. His words were simple but effected change in people's lives. Many hardcore sinners became followers and friends of Jesus. Even the evil one had to obey and submit to Jesus' commands. This should invite each one of us to reflect upon the authority of Jesus in our own lives too, and live up to his teachings.



This image of Jesus teaching in the synagogue should become dear to us. Know that the "synagogue" represents our own souls and that Jesus desires to be there speaking to us with authority and love, because we belong to him. Allow his words sink-in and make a big change in our lives. Jesus wants the best for us, he never wants us to fail or fall. Let's submit ourselves to his power and authority and be safe in his company. *Fr Leenus*
