Pastoral Visitation by Bishop Anthony Ireland

Bishop Anthony Ireland will be making his Canonical Pastoral Visit to our Parish from Friday 25 November—Sunday 27 November.

During the months leading up to his visit in November, we as a parish need to get ready with a number of things of much importance.

It would be great if we could, by then, form a Parish Pastoral Council/similar, so that Bishop will be able to Commission them on Sunday 27th November 2022.

Note: Parish Pastoral Council could have members who are ex-officio (eg Parish Priest, School Principal) elected (if possible), nominated (if need be) and by representation from different committees such as Finance Committee, Safeguarding Committee, Liturgy Committee, Outreach ministries and committees (includes Tony's Café) Formation Committee (includes Sunday School, Children Liturgy, Scripture Reflection Group, RCIA etc.) Social Committee, Fundraising Committee, R&M Committee, Legion Of Mary, St. Vincent de Paul Society, Youth Group etc.

As we know, most of the above committees/groups are non-existent here at present. During the coming months we shall make good effort in forming them as well.

Meanwhile we as a parish need to plan-out the future of our Parish, and also need to plan for the interior renovation of our church, which ideally be completed by 2023 so that we can enter 110th year of our Parish in 2024 with gladness and Gratitude to God.

We have a long way to go. God bless!

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

I believe all familiar with the life of Helen Keller. She, who was both blind and deaf, was once asked, "Suppose, you would be granted just one wish of yours, then what would you wish for?" Everyone thought, she would either wish for the gift of hearing or for the gift of sight for herself, but to everyone's surprise she replied, "I would wish for world peace."



In the Gospel of today we saw Jesus sending his 72 disciples to go and greet the people in every house saying, "Peace be to this home." Jesus knew that one of the greatest of human needs is peace. In every human heart there is a longing for peace. Everyone, every family and the whole world thirst for peace. And Jesus himself is the Prince of Peace.

I remember, some 12 years ago in a parish a survey was conducted re. many aspects of parish-life and life in general. The long questionnaire included a question on the five top-most needs/concerns of humans. In response, an overwhelming 79% of the respondents said World Peace (remember, that was in 2010 when the situation was not as bad as it is now). Among the topmost concerns the second position went to Family-Breakdown (causing lack of peace where we need it the most).

Today's Gospel gives us an assurance that in Jesus everyone, every family, and in fact the whole world can find true peace. Ultimately Jesus is the source of true peace; that is why He says, "Come to me, you who are burdened, I will give you rest." Peace is a gift from God. He alone can liberate us from the mess we have got ourselves into. In his apparitions he kept saying 'peace be with you'. 'Let your hearts be not troubled" (Jn.14:1).



Today Jesus is offering to calm our fears and heal the wounds of our past. Can anyone say no to this offer? Maybe, we would never say 'NO' to him consciously; maybe also, we have never said 'YES' to him consciously. When we wish peace for the whole world, can anyone deny it to oneself and to one's own family? Do our families not deserve the peace that we wish for the whole world? Peace makers do deserve to be at peace with themselves. Jesus calls them children of God.

Another big offer Jesus makes is that, while he remains the source of peace, he offers to make us the channels of peace. The very fact that Jesus sent on this peace mission not just the 12 disciples but the 72, means that this mission is not the work of just a handful of us, but the whole believing community is to become channels of peace. "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts" (Col 3:15) keep well, everyone Fr. Leenus
