

15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, Year B



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Jesus,

The Gospel of this Sunday reminds me of something from my Seminary days. It was in 1983 that a group of people from far came to share our seminary facilities for their 5 day retreat. Even though we brothers were not

given to participate in the retreat, on the final day of the

retreat we had our meals together with them, and were given some time to listen to their experiences. I remember them sharing about their experiences of 4th day of the retreat, when the Retreat Master had asked the participants to go out into the near by village 2 by 2. They were asked to keep walking until someone would stop them



for whatever reason. The Retreat Master also had appointed a few of the participants to stay back in the chapel and keep praying for those gone out. It was a half day 'practicals' for them. After a few hours those who had been sent out returned to tell their stories.

Some pair told us as to how they were stopped by some stranger and were asked to introduce themselves, and then they were invited into their home to pray over a bedridden member of the family. Some other pair had the wonderful experience of being asked to tell them more about Jesus, which they gladly did. And yet another

pair had the opportunity to listen to some one's tearful story and then to comfort them and pray over them. Thus each and every pair had some similar amasing experience of witnessing Christ and his love, to people who were hungry for truth, love and care.

The Retreat Master then told us that this sort of experience could always be seen wherever he had been to preach similar retreats. He also told us that the success of those who had been sent out in pairs very much depended on the group of the participants who had stayed back and kept praying for those gone out.

Dear all, everyone is not expected to be out there in the mission-fields to preach Christ, Yet by our Baptism each and everyone of us is given the task of preaching Christ in one way or another. The above story shows us that "Praying" is one of the greatest of contributions that anyone could make towards the success of the missionary works that Jesus has entrusted us with. If we truly love Jesus, we cannot stop praying that he be known and loved by all. And if we truly love others, we cannot stop telling them the truth of Christ and his great teachings.

In addition to 'praying', any opportunity to share our faith with another could be made the best use of. Again praying and preaching are not the only ways of making Jesus known and loved. Our good and exemplary lives should also lead many to the knowledge and love of Christ.

There is also a great need for each of us to grow in the knowledge of our faith. There needs to be lots of clarity in what we believe and as to why we believe what we believe. There is a lot of conflicting propaganda going around about our Catholic faith. A good source of right information is the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC). You can find it in the internet, or search 'Catholic.com'. Good answers re. the Sacraments of the Eucharist, the Reconciliation, and re. Devotion to Mary and the Saints, and the need to pray for the Departed Souls and on many more topics can be found in CCC and Catholic.com etc.

And always remember that unseen to us there are many missionaries, social workers and a good number of faithful lay volunteers spending their lives in reaching out to those hungry for the Truth. They are in the fields on our behalf too, because we cannot be there. They need our prayers more than anything else.
