Plenary Council Decrees

During the second general assembly, more than 35 motions were put to a consultative and a deliberative vote. Those motions that received a qualified majority in the deliberative vote – two-thirds of voters eligible and present – were passed by the Plenary Council. They were confirmed as the decrees of the Plenary Council.

Decree 1: Reconciliation - Healing Wounds, Receiving Gifts

Decree 2: Choosing Repentance - Seeking Healing

Decree 3: Called by Christ - Sent Forth as Mission Disciples

Decree 4: Witnessing to the Equal Dignity of Women and Men

Decree 5: Communion in Grace - Sacrament to the World

Decree 6: Formation and Leadership for Mission and Ministry

Decree 7: At the Service of Communion Participation and Mission – Governance

Decree 8: Integral Ecology and Conversion for the Sake of Our Common Home

Decree 9: The Implementation Phase of the Fifth Plenary Council

Decree 10: The Decrees of the Fourth Plenary Council of Australia

16th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C Martha and Mary

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Today's Gospel passage is about Martha and Mary. Or is it about Mary and Martha? "First come first", but who is first? Marthas or Marys? Work or Worship? Most of us would say, 'it really does not matter'. No, 'it does matter' says Jesus. Jesus noticed a busy Martha and a listening Mary. It's same in most families. When



someone visits our families, some of us would get busy preparing something, while others keeps the guest engaged in conversation. That is part of hospitality and that is well appreciated by Jesus too.

Therefore, by taking the example of Martha, who was much busy working, Jesus does not mean to say that, work is of less importance. And by taking the example of Mary, who kept listening, Jesus does not give any undue importance to prayer or worship. He means to say that, even those who have lots of works to do, should not neglect prayer. God wants us to listen to Him as he talks to us. He talks to everyone, for; all are his children; just as parents love to talk to all their children and vice-versa. So each and everyone has to listen to God.

Here in the Gospel, Martha is a symbol of work and activities; she symbolises busy people, action-oriented people, responsible people, who get the job done. It is discovered that a vast majority of the people are like "Martha". Busy all the time. The world needs people of that sort. It is good to be busy, doing good works. It is the hard working people who keep the world going. But what is less desirable of people like Martha is that most of them are too busy to listen to God and to talk to God.

And Mary has become the symbol of prayer and listening. Prayer has no less importance than work. It is by listening to God and by praying to Him that we can feed our souls as well. Work symbolised by Martha and Prayer symbolised by Mary do not contradict each other, rather they complement each other. Therefore, it's not that the people who work cannot pray or the people who pray need not work. They should go hand in hand.

But one of these should take precedence? Which? Jesus was asking Martha to get her priorities right. Jesus, sitting in the house of Mary and Martha, taught us this great spiritual lesson that, Prayer has precedence over work; and that, everyone should give due importance to one's prayer life. He tells us that, Prayer should come before any action; and that we need to listen to God first and then get busy. If we raise our hearts to God at the dawn of each day, and then our busy lives will have much more meaning.

So who comes first 'Martha or Mary'? According to Jesus it's Prayer followed by Work; listening first and Action second'. It is always in that order. He said: be hearers and doers of the Word. He never reversed that order. So, it is 'Mary followed by Martha'.

Let's talk to God and listen to him even as we work.
