

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

We may well remember how appreciative Jesus was of the people of great faith. Last Sunday's Gospel passage was very indicative of the appreciative-Jesus. He not only appreciated people of strong faith, but he was also willing to do anything for them. He worked great miracles for them. In fact, Jesus demanded faith as a prerequisite for miracles.



This Sunday's Gospel passage, on the other hand, speaks of the disappointment of Jesus at the unbelief he found among the people of his own village. Apparently their unbelief and rejection were caused by familiarity. Jesus was too much of 'one with them'. They were also not prepared to accept anything great or extraordinary from a person whose parents were of low status in the society. As a result, they had no faith in the powers of Jesus. No faith = No miracles. And Jesus moved on to other regions.

They mocked Jesus for being the son of poor parents. But today we are proud of them. Together with Jesus we are appreciative of his parents, Joseph and Mary. We acknowledge that they were truly rich in goodness and virtues. They were righteous and exemplary. We pay our respects to St. Joseph and Mary for being who they were to Jesus, and who they are to us today. They did all that was in their power then, and they do so now. May our faith in their Divine Son be strong and unwavering. May, we be worthy of his wonders. *Fr Leenus*
