The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, Year B



Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Jesus instituted the Sacrament of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, and from then the Eucharist, the Blessed Sacrament has always been with us. But the church felt the absence of a feast to honour the Eucharist. Therefore, in 1264 the Church introduced and included the Feast of “Corpus Christi” into the Liturgical Calendar. It’s now known as the Solemnity of “Body and Blood of Christ.”

A feast like this reminds us of the importance of appreciating and thanking God for Christ’s abiding presence in the Eucharist. Sadly, not everyone believes in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Even we who believe in the real presence, do so in varying degrees. Some believe in it without any doubt, others believe hesitantly.

Remember the miracle of Lanciano that took place nearly 1300 years ago. A Basilian monk in Lanciano, Italy, was doubting in the real presence of Our Lord in the Eucharist. He used to pray constantly for relief from his doubts. He doubted so much that he wanted to leave his priesthood. But one morning, while he was having a strong attack of doubt, he began the celebration of the Mass for the people of the town. The consecrated Bread and Wine caused his hands to shake, indeed his whole body. The host had turned into Flesh. The wine had turned into Blood. But that's not all. The miracle is ongoing. Once a pilgrim priest commended "Remember, this miracle that you are witnessing now, and that you have travelled so far to witness, happens every day in every church in the world, at the consecration of the Mass."

Over the centuries many tests have been made on the above mentioned “Body and Blood” . An extensive scientific research done in 1970, used the most modern scientific tools available. The results of the tests are as follows: The flesh is real flesh. The blood is real blood. The flesh consists of the muscular tissue of the heart. The flesh and blood belong to the human species. The flesh and blood have the same blood type (AB+) These findings are consistent with all other similar miracles. Let’s not doubt, but always approach the Eucharist with more lively faith and worship.

Always, let’s approach the Eucharist “worthily”. St Paul wrote to the Corinthians, “All who eat and drink the Body & Blood of Christ, in an unworthy manner, bring judgment against themselves.

“The eucharistic celebration is an encounter with the Risen Jesus”, Pope Francis said. “At the same time, it is a way of opening ourselves to the world as he taught us.”

Each time Catholics participate in the Eucharist, “Jesus comes and gives us the strength to love like he loved,” the Pope said, because the Eucharist “gives us the courage to encounter others, to go out of ourselves and open ourselves to others with love.”
