

Tony's Café 2022 Annual Report

As we celebrate the Feast of St Anthony this week, we also give thanks for the 13th birthday of Tony's Café, which is named after him.

Tony's Café is a parish outreach program which operates from our hall, on the corner opposite the church. Our sit-down weekly meal service began in 2009 and was soon extended to a second day. When Covid struck we switched to takeaway, averaging 300 meals a week.

Tony's Café finances itself by fundraising but during the pandemic this had to stop. We survived by the grace of God, City of Glen Eira Council grants and donations from Foodbank, OzHarvest, Bakers Delight and Kim Chi Grandma Restaurant in Carnegie, who every week supply us with vegetables. This enables us to provide grocery items, fresh fruit and vegetables, frozen meals and meat to the guests. We also run an op shop about once a month offering good warm clothing, shoes, cutlery, crockery and linen.

One of the strengths and blessings of the Café is the many, many volunteers who make all things possible. We thank all of you who offer us goods for our op shop and also those who make Tony's Café possible. Our volunteers do the shopping, drive the bus to collect donations, prepare meals, cook and serve, hand out meals and groceries to the guests, home deliver meals, wash endless dishes, clean the kitchen and the hall and make sure everything is tidy for those who use it next. All play their part to make Tony's Café the friendly place it is.

Our guests mainly come from the local area. As with the volunteers there are many different nationalities, cultures and personalities which adds vitality to our lives and every week more people are asking for help in different ways. This week a refugee family asked if we could help them with a vacuum cleaner (and a job), a young person is needing accommodation and a lady needs warm

clothing. If you can help with any of these please see Gwen or Veronica. New guests and volunteers are always welcome. We are there every Tuesday and Thursday

We would like to thank Father Leenus and all you wonderful parishioners who have helped in so many ways to keep Tony's Cafe going. May God bless you all for caring for His people in need, you are magnificent. I think St Anthony would thoroughly approve. Gwen.
