The Most Holy Trinity Sunday Vear A

Readings: Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9; 2Corinthians 13:11-13; John 3:16-18

The Word of God

Brothers, we wish you joy; try to grow perfect; encourage one another; have a common mind and live in peace, and the God of love and peace will be with you. Greet one another with the holy kiss. All God's holy people send you their greetings. The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

YOUCAT

We revere God as Father first of all because he is the Creator and cares lovingly for his creatures. Jesus, the Son of God, has taught us, furthermore, to regard his Father as our Father and to address him as "our Father". Several pre-Christian religions had the divine title "Father". Even before Jesus, the Israelites addressed God as their Father, realising that he is also like a mother. In human experience, father and mother stand for origin and authority, for what is protective and supportive. Jesus Christ shows us what God the Father is really like: "He who has seen me has seen the Father". In

the parable of the prodigal son, Jesus addresses the most profound human longings for a merciful father. *n37*

Jesus of Nazareth is the Son, the second divine person mentioned when we pray, "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit". Jesus was either an imposter who made himself Lord of the Sabbath and allowed himself to be addressed with the divine title "Lord" - or else he was really God. The scandal came when he forgave sins. In the eyes of his contemporaries, that was a crime deserving death. Through signs and miracles, but especially through the Resurrection, his disciples recognised who Jesus is and worshipped him as Lord. That is the faith of the Church. n39

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Holy Trinity and has the same divine majesty as the Father and the Son. When we discover the reality of God in us, we are dealing with the working of the Holy Spirit. God sent "the Spirit of his Son into our hearts", so that he might fill us completely. In the Holy Spirit a Christian finds profound joy, inner peace, and freedom. "For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the spirit of sonship (in whom) we cry, 'Abba! Father!" In the Holy Spirit whom we receive in Baptism and Confirmation we are permitted to call God "Father". *n38*

Praise and glory be to the omnipotence of the eternal Father, who in his providence created the world out of nothing.
Praise and glory be to the wisdom of his only-begotten Son, who redeemed the world with his Blood.

Praise and glory be to the holy and undivided Trinity, who formed us without our deserving it in their image.

We give praise and glory to you, most blessed Trinity, for the blessing of our creation, by which you granted us bodies and souls, you adorned us with your image and likeness, and added us to your Christian flock, making us sound and whole in our senses and in our members, above all the creatures who are beneath the heavens, and gave us your holy angels as our guides and ministers. For all this be pleased that we may praise you, world without end. Amen.

General Intercessions

Through the grace of the Son, we learn of the Father, and are drawn into the fellowship of the Holy Spirit. Through the Son, we come to the Father with prayers inspired by the Spirit.

1. For the holy Catholic Church, that we may be one in our faith in the Triune God.

2. For this world, that it may be saved through the Son sent by the Father.

3. For those who do not accept the true God, that they may come to the peace and love of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

4. For our families and for the sick, that we may help one another with the love which reflects the Trinity.

5. For the dead, that they may rejoice for ever in the glorious life of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Eternal Father, receive the prayers of this people, filled with the Holy Spirit, and offering Christ, your only Son, who lives and reigns for ever and ever. Amen.
