THE EUCHARIST IN YOUCAT

The Holy Eucharist

• Holy Eucharist is the sacrament in which Jesus Christ gives his Body and Blood—himself—for us, so that we too might give ourselves to him in love and be united with him in Holy Communion. In this way we are joined with the one Body of Christ, the Church. 208

Christ instituted the Holy Eucharist on the ٠ evening before his death, "on the night when he was betrayed" (1Cor 11:23), when he gathered the Apostles around him in the Upper Room in Jerusalem and celebrated the Last Supper with them. 209

Holy Mass

• Every Holy Mass (celebration of the Eucharist) unfolds in two main parts, the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist. 213

The Real Presence

• Christ is mysteriously but really present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. As often as the Church fulfills Jesus' command, "Do this in remembrance of me" (1Cor 11:24)., breaks the bread and offers the chalice, the same thing takes place today that happened then: Christ truly gives himself for us, and we truly gain a share in him. The unique and unrepeatable sacrifice of Christ on the Cross is made present on the altar; the work of our redemption is accomplished. 216

Receiving the Eucharist

 Someone who would like to receive Holy Eucharist must be Catholic. If there is a serious sin on my conscience, I must first make a Confession. Before approaching the Altar, we should be reconciled with our neighbour.

Those who receive Holy Communion are to abstain for 1 hour before hand from all food and drink with the exception of water and medicine. This does not apply to the elderly, the sick and those who care for them. A beautiful sign of reverence is to wear one's finest clothing-after all, we have a rendezvous with the Lord of the world. 220

Every Holy Communion unites me more • deeply with Christ, makes me a living member of the Body of Christ, renews the graces that I received in Baptism and Confirmation, and fortifies me for the battle against sin. 221

Sunday Mass

• A Catholic Christian attends Holy Mass on Sunday or on the vigil of Sunday. On that day we refrain from all work that would prevent us from worshipping God or disturb the festive, joyful, restful and restorative character of the day. Since Sunday is an Easter celebration that occurs each week. Christians from the earliest times have gathered together on that day to celebrate and thank their Redeemer and to reunite themselves with him and with others who are redeemed. So it is a central duty of every conscientious Catholic Christian to "keep holy" Sunday and the other holy days of the Church. One is exempted from it only by urgent family duties and important responsibilities in society. Because participation in the Sunday Eucharist is fundamental for a Christian life, the Church explicitly declares that it is a serious sin to stay away from Sunday Mass without good reason. 365

Eucharistic Adoration

 Christian adoration kneels before the divine Love that became man in Jesus Christ. Someone who really adores God kneels down before him or prostrates himself on the ground. This gives expression to the truth about the relation between man and God: He is great and we are little. At the same time, we are never greater than when we freely and devoutly kneel down before God. 485

Thanksgiving

• The greatest prayer of thanks is the Eucharist. ("thanksgiving" in Greek) of Jesus, in which he takes bread and wine so as to offer them to the God all of creation, transformed. Whenever Christians give thanks, they are joining in Jesus' great prayer of thanksgiving. For we, too, are transformed and redeemed by Jesus, and so from the depths of our hearts we can be grateful and tell 488 God this in a variety of ways.
