Spiritual meaning behind "Ordinary Time"

The colour for this liturgical season is green, associated with growth and knowledge and walking in the footsteps of Jesus's public life.

It has a spiritual focus.

In Latin this period of time is called "Tempus Per Annum," literally translated as "time during the year." The English translators chose to present it as "Ordinary Time," which has at its root the Latin word "ordo." This season takes its name from the ordinal numbers by which the Sundays are known (Second, Third, etc. Sunday in Ordinary Time).

Christmas and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ.

Ordinary Time is a specific season in the Church that focuses on the life of Christ during his three years of public ministry. That is why the start of Ordinary Time begins with the Baptism of the Lord, as that is the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. So while the season's name may appear to be an afterthought, it is not without meaning.
