

13th Ordinary Sunday, Year B

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Today's Gospel presents us with two miracles of Jesus; one a miracle of healing and the other of raising the dead.

I think, wherever this Gospel passage is being preached today, the focus of the preaching is on the miraculous healing of the haemorrhaging woman, rather than on the raising of the dead child. This could be true despite the fact that the greater miracle of the two is in fact raising of the dead.

Jesus performed hundreds of miracles; recorded and not recorded. In most of the miracles we can notice that Jesus performs an action and says a few words in order to make the miracle possible; e.g. in calming the sea, Jesus raises his hands over the sea and says, 'Be calm'; in the multiplication of the loaves, Jesus raises the loaves and says a prayer; in healing the blind, Jesus touches the eyes of the blind man with clay and says, 'Go and wash'.

But, only in the miracle of the healing of the woman with haemorrhage, Jesus does nothing and says nothing, yet the miracle happens. The woman herself is the one who touches the garment of Jesus and she herself says the words within herself. This miracle is therefore unique. It catches our attention more than the raising of the dead back to life. This is one of the basic reasons for our Catholic faith in the power of Relics.

In the Old Testament we read about the Mantle of Prophet Elijah which was given to Prophet Elisha. It was a powerful, miraculous mantle with which Elisha worked wonders. In Acts: 19:11-12 we read about Paul's handkerchief/apron which was put over the sick, who were thus healed.

There are many relics of Jesus which are considered to be of great importance. Such relics are well preserved, protected and venerated. They include, the remains from the Cross on which Jesus died; the nails and the crown of thorns which were used at His crucifixion, the Holy Grail, the chalice which Jesus used at the Last Supper, the Shroud of Turin, the piece of cloth with which Veronica wiped His face.

Remember, in our Holy Cross Church, Caulfield South, we have a small piece from the True Cross of Christ, as a Relic. Relics could also be of Saints; their clothing, the things they used in daily life, all are acceptable to us as relics, in varying degrees of faith. Remember, the altar of St Anthony's church, Glen Huntly includes the relics of Saints Dominic and Maria Goretti.

Many of us may not believe in relics at all, and therefore, touching them without faith may not cause a miracle. In the same way, many of those walking with Jesus would have touched him without experiencing any healing. They did not touch with faith. Relics are not like fire that will burn you even if you touch it unknowingly; or the electricity that will flow into your body even if you touch a live wire by mistake. But the power from Jesus flowed that day into the body of only one person, because she alone touched Jesus with faith and intentionally.
