

The Lenten Pilgrimage Walk


Sunday 5th March after 11 am Mass.

Second Sunday of Lent

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

We know people can easily give up on God. Anyone, we ourselves included, when faced with hardships may tend to question the very existence of God. The sufferings we see all around us also make us raise the same question. The series of natural disasters, the Covid19 pandemic, the ongoing war etc make many people lose their faith or at least weaken their faith in God. These are not any fictions, but are so real in the lives of the people of even our own times. Anyone may question the role of God in all these. These are also opportunities for atheists to laugh at those who believe in God.



While very many people may lose their faith in God because of whatever misfortune, sorrow, grief or otherwise, there are also very many people who even in worse circumstances still hold on to God and not let their faith be shaken. Some times the hardships are the very reason why even an atheist may turn toward God and cling to him.

We all may have come across people who once were so vehemently preaching against the existence of God, but now are full pledged preachers of the love and mercy of God. So, it is not so much that we have sad or joyful times; not even that we are believers or non believers; irrespective of all these, in every person there is a longing for God, a thirst that cannot be quenched until one sees the face of God and finds rest in him.

Jesus too, had his joyful and sorrowful times; glorious and luminous times. In all sorts of situations he was strong in his believes and remained united with his Father. Last week we heard about his hard times of trails and temptations when he refused to give up on God. This Sunday we hear about his joyful, luminous and glorious time of transfiguration; when too he remains so united with God the Father, and does not declare his independence.

Later he would be denied, betrayed and deserted by his own disciples, yet he would remain one with his Father. In bad times and in good his trust in his Father could never be shaken; and in turn, God the Father would reiterate his intimacy with his beloved Son, Jesus.

The transfiguration of Jesus is a reminder of the faithfulness of God. It's also an invitation for us to remain faithful to him. The appearance of Elijah and Moses by the side of Jesus shows that Jesus does not stand in isolation from the people of olden times. The fact that Jesus took his disciples with him shows that he does not stand in isolation from the people of his time either; and there should be no reason whatsoever, to think that Jesus would stand in isolation from the people of our own times or of any time. So, no matter what your experiences maybe, cling to the God who clings to you.

Peter, John and James were fearful disciples. During the transfiguration of Jesus their eyes were opened to see the intimacy of God. The memory of it kept them strong in faith all through their lives, in times of persecutions and other hardships, even to the point of death.

This Season of Lent is yet another opportunity for all of us to turn towards God, with a thirst to see the face of God and be satisfied. We are called to be bright shining like the sun, as Jesus showed us in his transfiguration.

God be with you, now and always!
