

# Collaborative Council Meeting

A Summary of the Fourth Collaborative Council Meeting held on 29th February 2024.

Representatives from the Parishes of Holy Cross, St Anthony's and St Joseph's met a fourth time to continue discussing how the these parishes, might conduct themselves to function better, based on some 'parish models' or frame work.

The particular focus thus far has been on the possible formation of a combined Parish Council or similar and other Committees.

At last week's meeting the group was joined by Jacqui Giuliani, an animator from the Southern Region of the Archdiocese.

Jacqui's presentation, based on the model used by Jesus himself, described the possibility of a Leadership Team: a small team working closely with the Parish Priest; a larger Parish Council; then successive layers formed from Ministry Leaders and Ministry Volunteers, with the whole Community as the foundation.

This model would work to develop the "pillars" of a vibrant parish, something which has been discussed at length at various parish meetings, namely Worship, Evangelisation, Fellowship, Discipleship and Service (outreach).

It was decided that the group should look at things which are going well as a model for growth. This will be the basis of the next meeting.

### 4th Lenten Sunday, Year B Power of the Cross



Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Cross, what is a cross? It's an intersecting of two lines or something. It's that simple. In fact a cross would have had no significance at all, if it were not for our Lord's sacrifice on a cross. From the time Jesus died on a cross it has never been the same. For the people of the Old Testament times, a cross was an instrument of shameful death for criminals.

Even now, for non-believers the word 'cross' would mean any sort of difficulties, troubles and pains etc. But for us who believe in Jesus the word 'cross' reminds us of the Cross of Christ. By his death on the Cross Jesus turned our hopelessness into hopefulness, sadness into joy and death into life.

A cross with the figure of Jesus on it is called a Crucifix, and a Crucifix is a source of grace, mercy, blessings etc. For the non-believers, it is a scandal, foolishness, and a stumbling block; but for us who believe, it's our joy, peace and life. We glory in the Cross of Christ.

Probably all of us make the sign of the cross on our foreheads several times a day. Maybe, many of the times at random or thoughtlessly. Why not we make a conscious effort always to make the sign of the cross meaningfully and with full attention?. Recently I read that it's a scientifically proven fact that the sign of the cross can truly work wonders! Let's develop the habit of blessing ourselves with the sign of the cross using Holy Water when possible.



There is also a longer version of the sign of the cross, a triple sign of the cross. We are used to making this triple sign of the cross before we read the Gospel at Mass. Of the triple crosses, the first is signed on the forehead, the second on the lips and the third on the chest; while saying "By the + Sign of the Cross + deliver me from my enemies + O Lord. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen".

"Far be it from me to glory except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world" St Paul.

"The crosses with which our path through life is strewn associate us with Jesus in the mystery of his crucifixion" St John Eudes.
