ST PATRICK'S DAY

St Patrick is patron of Ireland and the Archdiocese of Melbourne. He holds an almost unique place among the patron saints of western Europe, having become part of Irish tradition. This is the result of the growth of tradition over the centuries, but his writings show this Briton worthy of a place among the great national apostles. In Latin we have his *Confession*, an account and justification of his life and vocation, and his *Letter* to the soldiers of Coroticus. There is also, in Old Irish, his *Lorica or Breastplate*, set down in the ninth century, but certainly from the time of Patrick. It must be reckoned one of the truly great Christian hymns.

Christ was everything to Patrick, and his call to preach to the Irish came from God. These were his deep convictions. Just as deep was the conviction of his own unworthiness before God, and the consciousness of his limitations.

Christ be with me, Christ within me,
Christ behind me, Christ before me,
Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to
comfort and restore me, Christ beneath me,
Christ above me, Christ in the hearts of all that love
me, Christ in the mouth of friend and stranger.

The Joy of Sunday

The Sabbath is for the people of Israel the great sign commemorating God, the Creator and Redeemer.

The Sabbath recalls in the first place the seventh day of creation, when God "rested, and was refreshed" (Ex 31:17), this, so to speak, authorizes all people to interrupt their work and replenish their energies. Even slaves were supposed to be allowed to observe the Sabbath. This recalls the second great commemorative sign, the liberation of Israel from slavery in Egypt: "You shall remember that you (yourself) were a servant in the land of Egypt ..." (Dt 5:15). The Sabbath is therefore a feast of human freedom; on the Sabbath all breathe freely; on it the division of the world into masters and slaves is abolished. In traditional Judaism this day of freedom and rest is also a sort of foretaste of the world to come. YOUCAT n.362
