- Do I give in to anger or frustration with the people close to me?
- Do I lose my temper or insult people?

A Clouded Mind

- Do I trust in God's goodness or do I try to satisfy my desires all by myself?
- Do I look to material possessions to make me happy?
- Am I generous with my money and time? Do I engage in impure thoughts or fantasies? Do I act on them?
- Is my mind occupied with resentful thoughts from past hurts?

MEDITATION

The process of conversion and repentance was described by Jesus in the parable of the prodigal son, the center of which is the merciful father: the fascination of illusory freedom, the abandonment of the father's house; the extreme misery in which the son finds himself after squandering his fortune; his deep humiliation at finding himself obliged to feed swine, and still worse, at wanting to feed on the husks the pigs ate; his reflection on all he has lost; his repentance and decision to declare himself guilty before his father; the journey back; the father's generous welcome; the father's joy – all these are characteristic of the process of conversion. The beautiful robe, the ring, and the festive banquet are symbols of that new life – pure, worthy, and joyful – of anyone who returns to God and to the bosom of his family, which is the Church. Only the heart of Christ who knows the depths of his Father's love could reveal to us the abyss of his mercy in so simple and beautiful a ! way. Catechism of the Catholic Church n.1439

The Joy of Sunday

Catholic Christians attend Holy Mass on Sunday or on the vigil of Sunday. On that day we refrain from all work that would prevent us from worshipping God or disturbing the festive, joyful, restful, and restorative character of the day. Since Sunday is an Easter celebration that occurs each week, Christians from the earliest times have gathered together on that day to celebrate and thank their Redeemer and to reunite themselves with him and with others who are redeemed. So it is the central duty of every conscientious Catholic Christian to "keep holy" Sunday and the other holy days of the Church. One is exempted from it only by urgent family duties and important responsibilities in society. Because participation in the Sunday Eucharist is fundamental for Christian life, the Church explicitly declares that it is a serious sin to stay away from Sunday Mass without good reason.
