

6th Sunday of Easter, Year B Love as I have loved you.

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

In last weekend's Gospel Jesus had pleaded with us to remain in his love, just like branches to the vine. In this weekend's Gospel Jesus is commanding us to love as he

loved us. I always thought love is something spontaneous, and love cannot be forced or commanded. But if Jesus did command us to love, it means that even if loving does not come spontaneously, we must make a genuine effort to do so.

Loving God and loving others is our duty. It is not a request or a suggestion from Jesus. He does not give us any other option, but orders us to love. Jesus is not asking us to like everyone, but to love everyone. Liking everyone may not be possible, but loving everyone should be possible or else Jesus would not have commanded us to love all.

Jesus has something more to ask of us than just loving others. Jesus added "Love one another as I have loved you". That seems much more impossible. How did Jesus love us, anyway? He loved us by dying a cruel death for us. 'That is again sounding much more than the original commandment that said "Love your neighbour as yourself". Jesus wants from us a total "selflessness", especially when it comes to loving God and others.




