



Happy Mothers' Day



During a speech competition Tom, a seven year old boy, was giving a speech on the topic "The sayings of Jesus about himself". Tom began very well. He spoke out 'Jesus said I am the Way, Jesus said I am the Bread of Life, Jesus said I am the Good Shepherd, then Jesus said, Jesus said Jesus said.... Our little Tom could not remember the next saying of Jesus. Half way through his speech Tom forgot his lines. His mother was in the front row trying to help him by prompting. She gestured and formed the words silently with her lips. But it did not help Tom. Her son's memory was blank. Finally, she leaned forward

and whispered the line, "Jesus said, 'I am the light of the world". At this, Tom was overjoyed and with a great feeling and a loud and clear voice he continued, "Jesus said, my mum is the light of the world." And there was a loud applause by the crowd.

Like little Tom, each of us could say, "My mother is the light of the world". We could also agree with the statement, 'Mothers are the heart beat of the nation and they keep the nation going'. Mothers' Day is an opportunity given to us to acknowledge all that our mothers are to us, to appreciate them for being a guiding light in our lives, to thank them for all the trouble they take for us, to acknowledge all the sacrifices they make for us and to thank them for all the pain they endure for us. Without our mothers we would not have become who we are today.

Today we admit that it is not easy to be an exemplary mother. Mary the mother of Jesus is the best of examples of a Good Mother. She gave a new meaning to the role of a mother. She was always there for her Son. When everyone else gave Him up, she was there beneath the Cross. She spiritually united herself with the redemptive works of her Son. We can see Motherhood at its best in the motherhood of Mary. Through her the motherhood of any woman is sanctified.

Our mothers are praiseworthy. They may be mothers of little infants, mothers of school/college going children, mothers whose children are married and settled, mothers who have lost their children and mothers who are single parents etc. Every mother, grandmother and great grandmother will have amazing stories to tell of their children, grandchildren and great grandchildren, with tears of joy.

For many of the mothers, motherhood may have been fairly a joyous experience, in spite of the many hardships, they could rear their children without any dramatic difficulties. But all the mothers have not been blessed with a good family atmosphere or otherwise. A special word of appreciation to those mothers, who even in the face of unhelpful circumstances have withstood all that and have courageously chosen to love and live for their children, no matter what.

Today as we are here celebrating Mothers' Day, we don't have to pretend with God that there aren't any troubles in our families, or that we're managing ourselves very well. God knows what family life is like. He knows our heartaches and our conflicts, our joys and sorrows. He knows that loving makes us vulnerable. God is so well able to comfort us within our real family situations, and to enable us to cope with the troubles of life without being overwhelmed by them.

God gives us countless gifts. He has given us also the gift of our own dear mothers and grandmothers. Above all God loves us with a maternal love. May the same God answer all the tears and prayers of all the mothers. May Mary our Mother intercede with God for all our mothers. Once again, from all of us "A Happy Mothers Day" to all our Mothers.
