#### Take the Way of the Gospel

On 19<sup>th</sup> April 2023, a gathering was held of representatives from the Catholic parishes of the Southern Region of our Archdiocese, of which St Anthony's is part. St Anthony's was represented by Father Leenus, Gwen and Veronica. This was the first of a series of regional consultations, drawing on Pope Francis' key apostolic exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*, other Church documents around missionary renewal, and the call that Pope Francis and Archbishop Comensoli have invited us to "Take the Way of the Gospel".

In his opening remarks to the gathering, Bishop Tony Ireland referred to the Pentecost Letter of 2021, in which the Archbishop first outlined to the Catholic community of Melbourne his vision. "Our parishes will remain at the heart of the gathering of God's people locally, but we need to adapt the way we resource our local communities, including the placement of clergy, catechists and other lay leaders, to form Missions that comprise a family of faith communities."

Bearing in mind that the Archbishop has not proposed the closure of parishes, participants at the above-mentioned gathering were provided with questions to prompt conversation, and were encouraged to talk to people who were not from their parish, allowing them to learn from each other, inspire each other and identify wisdom together as a diocesan community. The results of the April gathering were shared in a word cloud – the overwhelmingly significant word being COMMUNITY. Other words were School, Youth, Faith, Collaboration, Renewal. Build. Mass. Outreach. This simple list does not really reflect the amount of thought which underpinned the conversations.

The first round of consultations, 'Leading for Mission' having been concluded, the second round of regional consultation sessions, Collaboration for Mission, will occur in late May and early June, and the third round of sessions, Formation for Mission, in August and September.

Moving forward, the responses from these conversations will inform the development of a "Take the Way of the Gospel" resource pack to support parishes.

## Mother's Day

Seven year old Tom was participating at a speech School. The topic was Jesus' sayings about himself. Tom started off saying, 'Jesus said I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. Then half way through the speech Tom forgot his lines. His mother was in the front row trying to help him by prompting. She gestured and formed the words silently with her lips. But it did not help. Her son's memory was blank. Finally, she leaned forward and whispered the line, "I am the light of the world." At this little Tom was overjoyed and with a great feeling and a loud and clear voice continued, "My mother is the light of the world."



Like little Tom, each of us could say that our mothers are light of the world. Mothers' Day is an opportunity given to us to acknowledge all that our mothers are to us; to appreciate them for being a guiding light in our lives; to thank them for all the trouble they take, for all the sacrifices they make and for all the pain they endure.
