

Pentecost Sunday

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Once, a huge cargo-ship got stuck in the muck of shallow waters. The whole day through, the captain and the crew tried to get the ship out of the muck. When all their efforts were of no success, the captain said, 'leave it alone'. The captain himself went back to his cabin and waited; they

waited for the hightide to come. That night when the hightide came, the waters lifted the thousand ton tanker off the muck and carried it back into the ocean.

This is one little way of understanding the power of the Holy Spirit. On the day of Pentecost too, a similar but a spiritual tidal wave swept over the disciples. We read in today's1st reading 'on 50th day after the resurrection of Our Lord, when the disciples were all together in prayer, there came from heaven a sound as of a violent wind which filled them and the entire house'. It changed their lives and enabled them to go out into the whole world boldly.

On that day the infant church truly sprang into life. That day, what was thought to be impossible was made possible by the Holy Spirit. It seemed so unlikely that the small group of unlearned, timid fishermen would come out into the open to preach to the world Jesus crucified. Earlier they were so fearful and lacked conviction and enthusiasm. But the spiritual tidal wave gave them a lift and it drove them to places unknown to them to accomplish a mission that was otherwise impossible.

In fact Jesus himself had instructed them not to go about preaching, unless and until they were filled with the Holy Spirit. It shows how important is the Holy Spirit in the life of any one. Without the Holy Spirit we cannot do anything properly.

To illustrate the gift of the Holy Spirit we could also be reminded of St. Vincent Pallotti, who as a primary school student was very poor at studies. Even his teachers would comment, 'Little Vincent is a living saint, he is an angel among us, but what a pity he does

not understanding a thing'. One day Vincent's mother suggested to him to pray the Novena to the Holy Spirit. Saintly and prayerful as he was, he prayed diligently to the Holy Spirit for nine consecutive days. Then there came in him a transformation. He then stood top in the whole school. Even his senior students would come to him for help with their studies.

The Holy Spirit is not something but Someone. Holy Spirit is a Person. He is the 3rd Person of the Holy Trinity. The essence of this Person is Love. The Father loves the Son so intently; and in turn the Son loves the Father so intently. The intensity of the love between God the Father and God the Son so great that, that love is a Person, whom we call God the Holy Spirit. God bless!

Glory Be

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.
