6th Sunday in Easter, Year C Jesus makes a promise of the Holy Spirit

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Promises are not anything new or strange to us. They have become part of our lives. This weekend, we saw an end to a series of promises; promises made by different political parties. Now that the votes have been cast already, we can be sure that we will not be bombarded with those promises, at-least for a while. We can now



look forward to the promises being materialised by those who made them. We also may have had many sad experiences of broken promises. We, as human beings cannot guarantee that our own promises would be kept, despite our best of intentions.

God makes promises too. God, being "God", is more than able to keep his promises without fail. In the beginning chapters of the Bible we read how God made a promise to our first parents, to send us a Saviour.to right the wrong, And we live in a period when that promise has been fulfilled by God who made the promise.

In the Gospel of today, it is Jesus himself who is making a promise to his disciples. Jesus promised them the Holy Spirit. In two weeks' time, we will be celebrating the anniversary of the fulfilment of that promise, "the Pentecost". Jesus had also promised us that he would be with us until the end of times; so he is truly with us in the form of the Holy Eucharist.

"A story is told of a father and his son. When the son was about to graduate from college. his father had promised him that he would gift him with a brand new car on the day of his graduation. In fact both of them together had even spent months considering cars of different makes and models, and at last a week before the graduation, they found the perfect car they were dreaming of. But when the graduation day came, the father handed his son with a 'gift-wrapped-Bible'. The son was so angry that he threw the Bible down on the floor and stormed out of the house. He and his father never saw each other again. Many years later, it was the news of his father's death that brought the son back home again.

And then a few days later, as the son was going through his father's possessions that he was to inherit, he came across the 'gift-wrapped-Bible' his father had given him. He brushed away the dust and opened it, and to his great surprise found enclosed in the Bible a cashier's check, dated the day of his graduation — with the exact amount needed for the car they had chosen together. He was stunned and sat there with his mind shattered. His father had kept the promise, while he himself was not even bothered to look into the gift".

God, our Father also has promised us the riches of heaven through His Son Jesus Christ. Moreover, God always keeps His Promises. And still many of us and most of the time live as if we do not believe His promise, as if the gift is not enough.

Today's readings are full of <u>promises</u> – the promise of divine indwelling, the promise of the gift of peace, the promise of the Paraclete, and finally, the promise of the New Jerusalem. Perhaps it will not be wrong, therefore, to call this Sunday – *'Promise Sunday.'*



A man is looking for a parking space, but without any luck. As he desperately drives around he prays to God. "Please God, if you find me a parking spot I promise I will go to church every Sunday and never touch a drop of alcohol again, please show me a parking spot" Immediately then he sees a parking spot. He gasps and heads toward it and says to God. "Never mind. I found one!"
