


# MANDATORY USE OF VICTORIAN GOVERNMENT QR CODE SERVICE FROM 28TH MAY 2021

## Visit of the Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady of Fatima


On the occasion of the Centenary Celebration of the Founding of the Legion of Mary the Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady of Fatima will visit our Parish

### PENTECOST SUNDAY



Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Once, a huge Cargo Ship got stuck in the muck of the shallow waters. The whole day the Captain and the Crew tried to get the ship out of the muck. When all their efforts were of no success, the Captain said, 'leave it alone'. And he himself went back to his cabin and waited; they waited for the high tide to come. That night when the tide came, the waters lifted the thousand ton tanker off the muck and carried it, light as a feather, back into the ocean.

This is one little way of understanding the power of the Holy Spirit. On the day of Pentecost too, a similar but a spiritual tidal wave swept over the disciples. As we read in the 1st reading of today, 'on the 50th day after the resurrection of Our Lord, when the disciples were all together in prayer, there came from heaven a sound as of a violent wind which filled them and the entire house. It transformed their lives.

This explains why Pentecost is spoken of as the birthday of the church. On that day the infant church truly sprang into life. That day, what was thought to be impossible was made possible by the Holy Spirit. It seemed so unlikely that the small group of unlearned timid fishermen would come out into the open to preach Jesus to the world. They were fearful and lacked conviction and enthusiasm. But the spiritual tidal wave gave them a lift and it drove them to places unknown to them to accomplish a mission that was otherwise impossible.

In fact Jesus Himself had instructed them not to go about preaching, unless and until they are filled with the Holy Spirit. So they were behind the closed doors not only because they were afraid of being put to death, but the real reason for their was to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit. It shows how important is the Holy Spirit in the life of any one. The Holy Spirit transforms our lives.

Holy Spirit is not something but someone. Holy Spirit is a Person. He is the 3rd Person of the Holy Trinity. The essence of this Person is Love. The Father loves the Son so intently; and in turn the Son loves the Father so intently. So intense is the love between the Father and the Son that, that love is a Person, whom we call the Holy Spirit.

Yet, of the three persons of the Holy Trinity, this third person is most neglected by most of us. Most of our prayers are addressed either to the Father or to the Son, Jesus. At the same time it is this same Holy Spirit, who inspires us to call upon the Father and the Son.

The same love of the Father and the Son is given to us in the person of the Holy Spirit especially through Baptism and Confirmation. We are therefore called the temples of the Holy Spirit. Let us make a conscious effort to acknowledge the transforming presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Let the Holy Spirit free us from the bondages we have got ourselves into; and lift us up to the spiritual heights unknown to us, filling us with enthusiasm, courage, understanding, and true love for our God and people.
