

Last Friday 7 May 2021, the Victorian Government announced that it is moving to a single QR Code COVID-19 check-in system.

This means that by 6pm on Friday, 28 May,

all Parishes must use the free Victorian Government QR Code Service

and have COVID marshals in place to ensure people are checking in at relevant Parish activities (e.g. Mass, weddings, funerals, baptisms etc. and use of Parish spaces for community events).

Manual record keeping (pen and paper) can only be used if electronic record keeping is temporarily unavailable such as during an internet outage.

THE ASCENSION OF OUR LORD

Can we really say, that it was ‘after’ He completed His work of redemption that Jesus ascended into heaven? Or, is it not more accurate to say, that it was ‘with’ His Ascension, that Jesus completed His Work of redemption?. In other words, Jesus’ Redemptive Work includes

1) His Death, 2) His Resurrection and 3) His Ascension.

By His Death, Jesus destroyed our death.

By His Resurrection, Jesus restored us to life.

By His Ascension, Jesus made us sharers in his divinity.

Just before His Ascension Jesus gave his Disciples two commands:

- 1) To be together and to keep praying for the coming of the Holy Spirit upon them. (This command is now applicable to us in our days).
- 2) To go out into the whole world, once filled with Holy Spirit, to preach and to baptise. (We are the disciples of Jesus, today. Do we follow this command of Our Lord in our own possible ways and circumstances?)

That day Jesus also gave them a Promise, that even though He was leaving for heaven, He would continue to be with us until the end of this world.

So, Jesus is present to us in a very special way in the Holy Eucharist. How do we respond to His living presence in the Blessed Sacrament?

GLOBAL WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHINA

23-30 May 2021

The Archbishop has asked for the upcoming week of prayer for the people of China in the week of 23-30 May 2021. There are reports that the persecution of people of faith in China has increased in recent times.

This not only includes Catholics and Christians but also Buddhists, Muslims and other believers who are routinely persecuted, imprisoned and tortured.

Earlier this year, the President of the Federation of Asian Bishops’ Conference, His Eminence Charles Cardinal Bo issued a call for a worldwide week of prayer for the Church and the people of China. More information and resources can be found at www.globalprayerforchina.org
