

- Only 5 reasons to leave home: Essential Shopping, Caregiving, Authorised Work, Exercise, Vaccination.
- Religious Ceremonies: No in-person gatherings.
- Face Masks: Everywhere except one's own home.
- Private and Public gatherings: Not permitted.
- Funerals: 10 + those necessary to conduct the service.
- Weddings: Not permitted.
- Aged Care: No visits, unless for exceptional circumstances.
- Hospitals: No visitors, unless for exceptional circumstances.


First Holy Communion to Sunday School Children

Holy Trinity Sunday



When anyone hears about our belief in One God-Three Persons, he/she is bound to ask, 'how's that?' How is it possible that the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit each of them is God, and yet there is only one God? We have no answer to the 'how' of it. We say 'It is a mystery." because it exceeds our ability to understand it.

This mystery sounds illogical to human minds. In fact, there needs to be no surprise that the inner nature of God cannot be understood by our little brains. Any reality that our brains can grasp or understand is by definition inferior to us. The Supreme God by definition has to be greater than our brains/minds. Therefore it is fitting that the inner nature of God is far more greater than our created minds, and so it remains a mystery to us. We should be proud of our big God, for being beyond our grasp.

We have a few believes related to our belief in 'Three Persons in One God'. Namely, we attribute the act of creation to God the Father, act of redemption to God the Son and the act of sanctification to God the Holy Spirit. Yet none of the Three exists nor acts in isolation from the other two. That is to say 'Father exists and creates together with the Son and the Holy Spirit; the Son exists and redeems together with the Father and the Holy Spirit; the Holy Spirit exists and sanctifies together with the Father and the Son.

A few wrong notions: that there are No Three Persons in One God, rather three manifestations of one and the same God. According to those who hold this notion, when God manifests Himself as the creator then He is the Father, when He manifests Himself as the redeemer then He is the Son, and when He manifests Himself as the Sanctifier then He is the Holy Spirit. (it's not a Catholic belief).

Some group of people hold the view that there is only One Person in One God. Yet others believe that because there are Three Persons in God, there must be three Gods. There are also some who argue that Jesus is not God, but a little less than God, and that the Holy Spirit is not God, nor he is a person but just a power. According to some others the Holy Spirit is only a ministering angel of God. Some group believes that the Father alone is eternal, having no beginning; the Son and the Holy Spirit had beginnings. (These are not Catholic beliefs).

What we Catholics believe is that these Three are real Persons distinct from Each other, yet inseparable. Each one is fully God, yet only One God. And that all three are eternal having neither beginning nor end even though the Son proceeds from the Father. the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. All three are equal in majesty and power. And that from all eternity God is interpersonal-three persons in perfect union of will and activity, so much so, that they is truly One God, not three. This Sunday is set apart as the 'Holy Trinity Sunday' not in order to try to understand or grasp the how of this mystery; rather in order to adore, glorify, praise, worship and thank the Most Holy Triune God.

So as we wonder at the Most Holy Trinity we have a reason to wonder at ourselves, too. We wonder at the fact that we are created in the image of the same Trinitarian God. Since we are created in the image of One God in Three Persons it tells us of the kind of people we should be. Though, we are many distinct persons, yet we are to live and function as though we are but one. Just as God does not exist in isolated individualism, rather in a community of relationships, so too, we who are created in His image and likeness must shun every tendency to isolationism and individualism, and live one in heart and mind.
