

Solemnity Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, Year A

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus.

2023 years ago a boy was born in a cave-manger, and they called him a King; "Where is the new born King they asked." 33 years later he was brought face to face with another king. Pontius Pilate, who asked Jesus "are you a king?" and Jesus answered, "you say so". Jesus probably meant to say, 'You say that I am "a king", but I say "I am the King," The King of kings'. So, we gladly acclaim Jesus to be the King of kings and Lord of Lords.

The irony was that Pilate the king was in his royal robes, but the King of kings, the King of the Universe was facing him wearing just a tunic, that too torn by the flogging. Pilate was seated on a majestic throne, King of kings was made to stand there, his too hands tied. Pilate was wearing a crown of Gold and Jewels, while the King of kings was made to wear a crown of thorns. Pilate the king was holding a sceptre, showing his authority and power, while the King of kings, Jesus was given a reed to hold in mockery. Pilate the king was in his full earthly glory, while the King of kings was standing like a sheep ready for slaughter.

That was some 2000 years ago. Today as we celebrate not the Good Friday, but the Solemnity of Christ the King, we see that the roles are reversed. Today the King of kings has the Clouds for his throne. He is even riding on the Clouds as his chariot. No soldiers around him pulling and pushing, but millions of angels to carry out his orders. The King of

Rome could not convict Him.
The cross could not conquer Him.
The grave could not contain Him.
Satan could not defeat Him.
Why? Because He was and is,
and forevermore shall be, the

kings is shown today in his full power and glory. Brought before his Judgement Seat is not Pontius Pilate, or Herod or Caesar only, but the whole humanity, including you and me.

Let us be thankful to Christ the King for having called us to partake in His eternal Kingdom. Let us always remain loyal to Christ not only on this feast of Christ the King, but on every day of our life, be submitted to Him. He loves to be the King of our hearts, the King of our lives. Let us invite Him to rule over our lives as He wills.
