First Sunday of Advent, Year A Stay Awake

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus.

Firstly, I wish you all A HAPPY NEW YEAR though it sounds strange to hear new year wishes in November. In fact today is the 1st day of the New Liturgical Year. The very 1st Season of the Liturgical year is that of Advent, a time of preparation and waiting for the Lord.



Today being the first day of a new year anyone would expect the readings to be about the beginning of the world, about the creation story or the like. But today's readings, especially the Gospel deals with the last day. How do we justify this choice of the readings? The readings seem to be unfit for the first day of the liturgical year. Has the Church made a mistake in choosing them for today?

The choice of the readings is not by mistake, it is done on purpose. Because, Advent is a time of preparation not only in view of Christmas but equally a time of preparation in view of the end times, as well.

At the same time, the Church wants us also to live in the present, because, Jesus not only HAD COME 2000 years ago; He not only WILL COME in the future; but also He EVER COMES in our present time. That's why today's readings speak also about staying awake at all times.

"Staying Awake" is not to be understood as the opposite of "Going to Sleep". Much more, it means that we should be "Vigilant" and "Alert". More than "physically staying awake", what is meant here is "Spiritually Staying Awake" That is to say, 'a spiritual awakening' of our lives is called for during Advent Season. In other words, "the spiritual awakening" of our lives is not something that can be put off for a later date.

Our moral failings should be 'dealt with' at the earliest. When the Lord comes, whatever that may be unacceptable to Him shall not be found in our lives: and whatever may be pleasing to Him should be found. Staying Awake is to 'actively looking for the opportunities to serve, to do good works, to reconcile, to make amends and avoid wrong choices. Being awake is to look for different ways to grow in intimacy with the Lord and make spiritual progress.

The Bible reminds us that, anyone who wants to make spiritual progress is bound to be at war with the enemy. And if we are at war we cannot but be alert; like the soldiers stay awake and are alert and watchful. St. Peter in his letter (1 Peter 5:8) says, "Be alert and watch out! Your enemy the devil is roaming around like a roaring lion, looking for someone to eat. Be firm in your faith and resist him".

Let us then, take advantage of the present moment and stay awake and be ever ready to welcome Jesus into our lives today and every day. Keep safe and keep well.

A Protestant pastor and his team are going around raising funds to build a new church. They go to a Catholic Priest and say "father, we are from the neighboring Protestant Parish, we have a small, old church, we are planning to pull it down and build a bigger new church in its place. Please donate". The Catholic priest is confused and he thinks it is wrong for a Catholic to donate towards a Protestant church. After some hard thinking he gets an idea, and he rushes to his room and comes back with a Cheque, he hands it to the Protestant pastor and says, 'it is not for building the new church, but to pull down the existing one".
