Archbishop Comensoli has written to all Melbourne priests about the future and governance of parish schools.

The Archbishop met with priests on Friday (4/10) We are under an obligation to implement changes required under Victorian Government regulations in relation to School funding, in addition to recommendations of the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse that were accepted by the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference. This has been under consideration for some time. Our schools are a fruit of the mission endeavours of previous Catholic generations, and a frontline in the work of mission and evangelization.

SEALED—THE SAINT WHO DIED FOR PENTITENTS— AND THE SECRECY OF CONFESSION I

While he is not in the Universal Calendar of the Church, Saint John Nepomucene has suddenly become a most relevant saint. John Woelflein was born in the town of Pomucu in Bohemia (today's Czech Republic) in the mid fourteenth century. He became a priest and finally died a martyr's death in Prague in 1393. He is still venerated in Middle Europe.

While studying in Rome, I lived in the Collegio Nepomuceno on the Piazza Zama, at that time the Czechoslovakian seminary that bore his name. I wondered about his statue in the college hall. Here was a priest in surplice, violet stole and biretta, holding his index finger to his lips, as if to say, "Hush...I am keeping a secret..." and indeed he kept the great and binding secret, the seal of confession. It was for faithfully keeping the seal that St John Nepomucene suffered a violent death. The circumstances were tragic and sordid.

After high achievements in theology in the new University of Prague and in canon law in the University of Padua, John was appointed parish priest of Our Lady of Tien in Prague. With a reputation for sincerity and holiness, his preaching drew great crowds of citizens and students. Many returned to the sacraments at a time when people in Europe carried recent painful memories of the Black Death (1346-1353).

The horrors of the plague, with so much suffering and death, had negative spiritual effects in many people's lives, including despair, pessimism, indifference or hostility to God. By preaching and patiently hearing their confessions, John gave people hope. He assured them that the merciful grace of God's forgiveness is always available for all of us in the sacrament of pardon and peace.

John was supported by the Archbishop of Prague, who wished to bestow promotion and honours on him, which in humility he rejected. At the same time, his reputation came to the attention of King Wenceslaus IV, who appointed him chaplain to the royal court and confessor to the Queen. But there was a competitive rift between the archbishop and the king. This was the time of the "papal schism" when there were two Popes, one in Rome, the other in Avignon, France. The archbishop and John looked to the true Pope in Rome. For political reasons, because he was in line to be elected Holy Roman Emperor, the king looked to France.
