#### **MEDITATION**

Jesus means in Hebrew "God saves". In the Acts of the Apostles Peter says, "There is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved" This is essentially the message that all missionaries brought to people.

The brief formula "Jesus is the Christ" expresses the core of the Christian faith: Jesus, the simple carpenter's son from Nazareth, is the long-awaited Messiah and Saviour.

Both the Greek word "Christos" and the Hebrew word "Messiah" mean "the Anointed One". In Israel kings, priests, and prophets were anointed. The apostles learned that Jesus was anointed "with the Holy Spirit". We are called Christians after Christ, as an expression of our exalted vocation.

# SEALED—THE SAINT WHO DIED FOR PENTITENTS— AND THE SECRECY OF CONFESSION II

Nicknamed "the idle one", he might well be called "bad king Wenceslaus" to distinguish him from "good king Wenceslaus", the saint we recall in the Christmas carol. Lazy, drunken, bad tempered and bad-minded, Wenceslaus soon fixated on his wife's saintly confessor. Gripped by paranoia and gnawing suspicion, he wondered: "What is my wife telling that priest in confession?"

He fantasised that this devout and pure woman was being unfaithful to him, so he was determined to get information out of John, even if that meant violating the sacred seal of confession. But John would not respond to the royal demands. When questioned, he stood facing the king and remained silent.

At first, the king tried to bribe the silent priest, then he began to make threats, finally he arrested him and had him tortured. Still John would not say a word. The queen interceded for her confessor and he was released for a time. Then in a fit of drunken rage the king ordered his henchman to stalk and murder John. They seized and bound him and threw him into the river Moldau.

It is said that when the king looked over the river that night, he saw five mysterious lights or stars hovering over the priest's body floating in the water. Wenceslaus fled to a country estate. The people retrieved the corpse and, at the queen's command, John was buried with a majestic public funeral. He was acclaimed a saint by the people, the priest who died for their right to security and confidentiality in the internal forum of sacramental Penance.
