Mandatory vaccinations for Parish Employees and Volunteers

The Archdiocese have advised that all religious workers (paid/volunteers) who work at or in connection with a place of worship will be subject to Mandatory Vaccination.

In order to continue working, they must provide Vaccine Information to the Parish. The Parish will hold this information in confidence and not disclose it to any person except as required by law. Vaccination information can be recorded in a variety of documents such as a letter from: a medical practitioner, a certificate of immunisation or an immunisation history statement obtained from the Australian Immunisation Register.

Jesus, the Suffering Servant

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

I suppose, at least some of you may have been taken aback by the very sight of this Newsletter. Even though the graphic images in here are familiar ones, yet we did not expect them at this time. These images take our thoughts to Good Friday, but today is neither the Good Friday, nor are we in the Holy Week, nor in the Season of Lent. Then what is the reason for this theme to be brought up now in this Ordinary Season? The



Gospel of today talks about the impending Sufferings and Death of Jesus; that's good enough reason for us to reflect a bit upon His Sufferings. In fact, we do not need any special reason or special season to reflect on the Passion, Death and the Resurrection of Jesus that has brought us so great a Salvation.

It was Prophet Isaiah of the Old Testament who predicted that the would be Messiah will have to suffer unimaginable pains. It was the same Prophet who also referred to the Messiah as the "Suffering Servant". So, Jesus is rightly called the "Suffering Servant", but hardly any of us would like to call Jesus by that title. Yet we proudly acknowledge that Jesus humbled himself so much so that "He became obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross." As centuries pass by, Jesus keeps revealing to the humanity the various aspects of his sufferings, as well as the graces that flow from every Wound in his Precious Body. Isaiah in 53:5 says "By His Stripes, We Are Healed". In 12th century Jesus revealed to St. Bernard the pains related to his Shoulder Wound. So, now without looking for reasons and seasons let's reflect on the sufferings of Jesus, caused by His Shoulder Wound.

THE SHOULDER WOUND OF JESUS

It is recorded in the writings of St. Bernard Clairvaux that in a vision he asked Our Lord as to which was His greatest suffering that is not recorded in any of the sacred writings. Our



Lord answered, "While I bore My Cross on the Way of Sorrows, the Cross made a grievous Wound on My Shoulder, which was more painful than the other wounds, and which is not recorded by any one. Honor this Wound on My Shoulder with thy devotion and I will grant you whatsoever you ask through its virtue and merit. And in regard to all those who venerate this Wound I will remit to them all their venial sins and will no

longer remember their mortal sins" This revelation and promise of Our Dear Saviour is another proof of His Unlimited Mercy. You are urged to say these prayers daily and to promulgate this prayer on a continuous basis, so that others too may share in his blessings and graces that flow from the 'Shoulder Wound of Jesus".

PRAYER TO THE SHOULDER WOUND OF JESUS

O Loving Jesus, meek Lamb of God, I a miserable sinner, salute and worship the Most Sacred Wound of Thy Shoulder, on which Thou didst bear Thy heavy cross, which so tore Thy Flesh and laid bare Thy Bones as to inflict on Thee an anguish greater than any other Wound of THY Most Blessed Body. I adore Thee, O Jesus Most Sorrowful: I praise and glorify Thee and give Thee thanks for this most sacred and painful wound, beseeching Thee by that exceeding pain and by the crushing burden of Thy heavy cross to be merciful to me, a sinner, to forgive me my mortal and venial sins, and to heal me and lead me on towards Heaven along the Way of Thy Cross. Amen.
