St Anthony's Planning Group with St Joseph's & Holy Cross Parish Council Thursday, 19th October 2023, held at Holy Cross, Caulfield South.

This new collective group will be called the "Collaborative Council."

Fr Leenus' appointment date is 1 November, 2023. It was agreed that a Welcome Lunch for Fr Leenus, Fr Pat, Brother Lindsay and Parishioners from all three parishes will be held on Sunday 12 November at St Joseph's.

This above mentioned function will be promoted in next weekend's Newsletter with an RSVP date.

Schedule for Weekend & Weekday Masses, All Saints & All Souls Masses and Volunteers Thank You Mass & Fellowship, were discussed.

Holy Cross: Sunday 9am.(Weekday Mass TBA)

St Josephs': Vigil 6.30pm, Sunday 10.30am. (Weekday Mass TBA)

All Saints' Day Mass: Wednesday, 1st November. St Anthony's, 9.15am and 7pm; At St Joseph's 7pm.

All Soul's Day: Thursday, 2nd November. St Anthony's, 9.15am and 7pm; At Holy Cross at 7pm.

Mass will be shared between Fr Leenus and Fr Pat (and other priests will be scheduled as required).

Volunteers Thank You Mass & Fellowship: Friday, 24th November – Mass at 7pm for all Parishes at St Anthonys, followed by light dinner at the Parish Hall.

The new "Collaborative Council" comprising members from all three parishes will collectively work towards the establishing of Parish Councils and other committees in the respective parishes.

The recommendations from the Open Parish meetings, the "Pillars of Parish Life" model, which embraces all aspects of parish life, is to be developed to suit the needs of each parish.

At the next meeting, the Collaborative Council will define the generic "Pillars", in which all the ministries, events, programs and activities of all three parishes will be defined and categorized.

It was noted the Financial entities will remain separate for each Parish.


Please note: These three parishes are not combined, nor amalgamated, but are collaborative partner parishes.

"I continue to follow with great sorrow what is happening in Israel and Palestine. I think again of the many people in particular, of the children and the elderly.


I renew my appeal for the freeing of the hostages and I strongly ask that children, the sick, the elderly, women, and all civilians not be made victims of the conflict. Humanitarian law is to be respected, especially in Gaza, where it is urgent and necessary to ensure humanitarian corridors and to come to the aid of the entire population. Brothers and sisters, already many have died.



Please, let no more innocent blood be shed, neither in the Holy Land nor in Ukraine, nor in any other place! Enough!

Wars are always a defeat, always! Prayer is the meek and holy force to oppose the diabolical force of hatred, terrorism and war. Let us pray to Our Lady. [Hail Mary]."
