



Mission Sunday

In a short duration about 2000 years Christianity has become the largest of all the religions in the world. Christianity is well known not only for its number of followers, but for its quality as well. Christianity is appreciated for its involvement in the areas of social work, education, health care, struggle against injustice etc. This means that on this Mission Sundays we reflect not only on our involvement in spreading of our faith, but also on our involvement in the overall well being of humanity.

Today let's reflect on the question 'how do I promote the Gospel and humanitarian works?" In other words, let each of us ask oneself 'what is my response to the 2000 year old command of the Lord? "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit".

There are people who say that this command of the Lord is irrelevant today; the times have changed, or that it does not concern me; or it's the concern of the Pope, bishops, priests religious etc. There are also people who say that it is sufficient to live an exemplary life. There are also people who say that it is wrong to go about proclaiming our faith, for it might cause conflicts.

On Mission Day we are reminded that missionary work is more relevant today than ever before, and that it concerns every baptised Christian, no matter what position he/she holds. It is the baptism that gives us the right and duty to proclaim the gospel. An exemplary life of a Christian is a good witness. Yet that is not sufficient. It does not help the needy.

Even amidst the growing differences of opinions and difficulties, Christ's command to evangelize all peoples continues to be our priority. No reason can justify us taking it easy. Because, there are countless people who are waiting and thirsting for the truth, love and care. We are called to reach out to them. Will our good examples alone help them?

The church is missionary by its nature. That is its character and its identity. There are religions which don't care to spread their faith; that is because they are not missionary by nature. But we are. Our missionary character comes from our founder Himself, who went about preaching and also asked to do the same. St Paul in Ist Cor.9:16 says, "Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel".

Always remember that unseen to us there are missionaries, social workers and a good number of faithful lay volunteers spending their lives in reaching out to the needy. They are in the field on our behalf, too, because we cannot be there. They need our prayers as well as our financial support. Therefore, a generous contribution from a generous heart would be much appreciated .

The church today requests contribution from us not because we have a lot, but, because the church heavily depends on its members for the numerous good works we, the church is engaged in. If Christianity has grown to be the largest religion and doing well, it is made possible by the generosity of one and all.
