SEALED—THE SAINT WHO DIED FOR PENTITENTS— AND THE SECRECY OF CONFESSION III

The Canon Law of the Church binds every priest hearing confessions. There is no squiggle room for his conscience, or exceptions and special cases. The priest is so strictly bound to the seal that, if he violates it directly, he incurs automatic excommunication. This is why, in July 2019, the Vatican department for confessional matters, the Sacred Penitentiary, repeated the rules regarding the seal in a special instruction, addressed to the whole Church. The instruction sets the issue in the real context of media "tell all" trends and the political forces that seek to sweep aside confidentiality without respect for people.

Apart from St John Nepomucene, other priests have held firm and maintained the sacred silence in the face of intimidation and threats. One man stands out, a young New Zealand Columban priest, Fr Francis Vernon Douglas, who was working in the Philippines when the Japanese invaded and occupied the country. The Japanese allowed him to continue his ministry, along with other priests from the allied nations, as long as they limited their work to spiritual matters. That was no problem until the Japanese began to lose the war.

In 1943 Fr Douglas was induced to minister to some Filipino guerrillas and American servicemen who were hiding in the mountains. This risky work compromised him. The Japanese police knew he was hearing confessions and they arrested him. He was repeatedly tortured to force him to tell what he had heard in confession. But he said not a word, keeping the holy silence of a faithful pastor. Then, broken in body, he was taken away and he was never seen again. Unlike St John Nepomucene, his body has never been found. Yet there are moves to canonize this brave young priest who kept the great secret "even unto death". Like St John Nepomucene, his witness speaks to us, to encourage and inspire us today as we face new pressures and challenges catholicweekly.com.au
