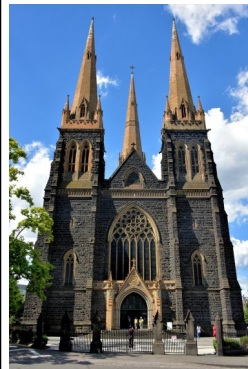

Grateful Leper

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Today's readings highlight the importance of being grateful. It is a sin to be ungrateful. Former US President Abraham Lincoln, realising that the people of his country were ungrateful to God, he was deeply sad. He said that, America had received from God the choicest of blessings; God had preserved them in prosperity and in peace; wealth and power; glory and majesty, yet the people of the nation had forgotten the God who gave them all these and more; instead, they had vainly imagined that all these were their own making. And then he went on to declare a national day of fast, and thanked God for all that God had done to them.

The Sin of Ingratitude is prevalent here as it is elsewhere. It is prevalent today as it was at the time of Jesus. During His time, Jesus had worked wonders in the lives of thousands of people; not only in the lives of ten lepers. Jesus fed thousands of hungry people, turned water into wine; many who were blind, deaf, dumb or lame were cured; paralytics were restored to health and the dead were raised; but how many of them were really grateful to Jesus? And how many of us do turn to the Lord in thanksgiving?

In the Old Testament we have good examples of grateful people. For example, King David was grateful to God for the generosity of people in building God's Temple. He expressed his earnest and sincere gratitude to God by glorifying God, praising Him and by singing and dancing for God. He acknowledged that all good things came from God.

Today's first reading reminded us of Naaman, who was thankful to God for his cure. In the second reading St. Paul asks us to remember Jesus with gratitude; For He heals and strengthens us to face any adversity; and to thank Him for His death and resurrection.

St. Paul again writes, "In everything give thanks to God"; in our good times as well as in our bad times, thank God. In sickness and in good health, we are to thank God. Psalm 92 says, in the morning it is good to thank the LORD for His loving kindness and in the evening for His faithfulness.

We never run out of reasons to thank God for! Countless are the blessings we have received; look within you, look around you. A recovery from a terrible illness is not the only reason to thank God for. Thank God also for all the terrible things that God preserved you from. Thank God for all the illness and perils that never came your way. Take nothing for granted.

But does God need our gratitude. NO! Yet God asks us to be grateful, because it helps ourselves. One leper came back to thank Jesus and therefore he found the True Saviour; Naaman was grateful and he found the Only True God, Abraham Lincoln was grateful to God and in his time America grew prosperous and experienced peace and joy. By being grateful anyone can experience god's favour.
