

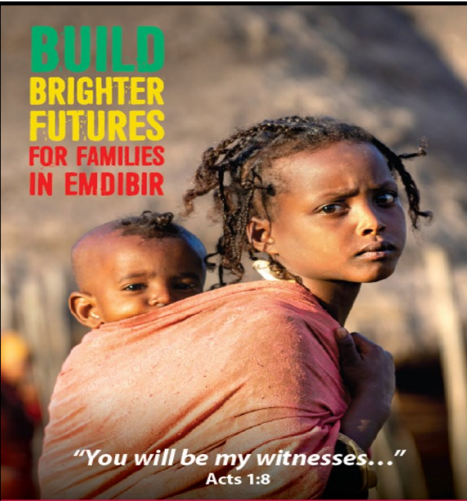

## St Anthony's Plant Sale Sunday 6 November

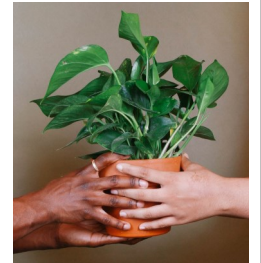

## Ordinary Sunday C 29

### Persistent Widow

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

We have just heard of a woman who wouldn't take 'no' for an answer. She was determined to go any far and any number of times, but would not give up trying and crying. Jesus says, 'that is how we should be in our prayer-life'. According to the Bible this woman is known as the "persistent widow". She must have had a very good reason to be so persistent.



The parable of the persistent woman, reminds us of St. Mary MacKillop. It was from Australia that she went as far as Rome, in the year 1873 to meet with the Pope and make her request. Her cry was on behalf of the poor. Therefore, she was determined to be heard. By the way, this Saturday, 17<sup>th</sup> October marks the 12th anniversary of her Canonisation.

Another example I could think of is that of St. Monica. She persisted in praying for her wayward son for 33 long years. Was she heard? Yes, more than heard. Her prayers were just that her son may return to Catholic faith'. But in answer to her persistent prayers, God not only brought him back to the faith, but made him a priest, a Bishop and a Saint, St. Augustine, one of the greatest of saints.

In the Bible there are very many examples of people who prayed in tears for years, and when at last God answered them He did it beyond any measure. One of those examples is of a couple, who were growing into old age, having no children. But they kept praying to God to give them a child. There was no answer for very many years. But they were not disheartened or disappointed, nor did they give up praying in tears. Joachim and Anne, were they answered? Yes, more than answered. Their persistent prayers were answered with a girl child, whose name is Mary, who in turn gave us Our Redeemer.



Persistent prayers are always answered in abundance. But, by giving these examples I do not mean to convey a wrong message that God is hard-hearted; that only if we cry and wail for very many long years would He answer. We believe that, God answers every true prayer even if said only once. He cares about us even if we do not pray at all. These examples tell us as to "how much more" He would bless us, if we persist in our prayer life;

### Child Safety—Your Responsibility
