

#### Fathers Day Appeal for Retired and Sick Priests—This Sunday

Some 50 years ago with the introduction of the "new" canon law Archbishop Knox introduced the practice of priests retiring at age 75. Until then, priests literally "died with their boots on" because an elderly diocesan priest had nowhere to live, apart from his presbytery.

In 1990 Archbishop Little established the Priests Retirement Foundation with the motto "caring for those who cared".

Priests are not employees of the Archbishop or the Parish so they are not eligible for Superannuation. Like everyone else in the workplace, priests provide for their retirement by contributing 12.5% of the weekly presbytery collection to the Foundation.

Last financial year the Foundation spent \$4.375 million dollars "caring for those who cared" - our retired priests.

The Foundation depends on your support.

Father's Day

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

On father's day we try in various ways to tell our dads that they are very special to us. We try to say it by giving them some gifts or if they are far away by giving them a call or by sending them a message; if in aged care by giving them a visit; in most cases by

having a special meal with them and in any case by praying for them and by asking God to bless them.

Fathers are wonderful people, but very often we take them for granted. Sometimes we fail to understand them. We refer to them as too busy people. Busy in the office, field or factory; as one who has no time to spend with the family. We do not care to see that it is for the sake of the family that they are busy. We do not care to see, how they struggle to keep the family going or make both ends meet.

One day a little girl went into her dad's office and said, "Daddy, come and see the picture I am drawing" and the dad replied "Not now, honey, Dad's busy." About 10 minutes later, again she came back to the office and said, "Daddy, please come and see the picture I am drawing" And the dad replied, "I'm busy, don't bother me" An hour later, the dad came out to see the picture. In the picture he could see the little girl, her brother and her mum standing in the loan with the family dog. And so the dad said, "That's a nice picture, but how come I'm not in the picture?" And the girl said, "You're in the office, daddy." The dad was moved to tears. The girl failed to see that her daddy was busy for the sake of the family. On the other hand the father gave priority to his work rather than to his family. Being a good dad means not only being good at one's work; but being good at home as well. A special care is to be taken to put family ahead of one's work.

An author once said, "The greatest gift his dad ever gave him was a small box. Inside the box was a piece of paper on which was written. "Son, this year I will give you 365 hours, an hour every day after supper. It's all yours. We'll talk about what you want to talk about. We'll go where you want to go. Play what you want to play. It will be your hour. And I will be with you" "The author says that his dad not only kept his promise, "but every year he renewed it'. The time his father spent with him was the greatest gift he ever received.

Goodness of a dad, his greatness and his success all depend on how he relates himself with God the Father, because a dad is a spiritual representative of God the Father. He is to act on behalf of God. Therefore he should also be compassionate, loving and forgiving as God Himself is. He is also to be proud of his family.

We read in the Bible that God's plan for a father is to be the provider for his family. That is his primary responsibility; When the Bible says you're to be the provider, it means providing the family with more than just the material things. He is to be also the provider of security, the provider of an atmosphere conducive to peace, love, care and support. May God shower his choicest blessings upon our families through our mums and dads.
