



# 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C Lost and Found

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

Once a preacher held out a new, crisp and clean 20 dollar note and asked the congregation if anyone wanted it; all hands went up. Then he wrinkled the \$20 note within his palm and then asked if anyone still wanted it; again all hands



went up. Then he threw the note down, trampled it under his feet, soiled it and then picked it up and repeated the question if anyone still wanted it. Again all hands went up.

So that is how we look at a currency note; we see its value despite its being wrinkled and soiled. And that is how God looks at us; He sees our true worth despite our sinfulness. But always that is not the way we see others, especially if they are sinful. That is the reason why Jesus taught us these parables; the parables of the Lost Coin, the Lost Sheep and the Prodigal Son.

These parables call us not to look at each other negatively; rather to see in each other God's own image and to see them as valuable and lovable people. Secondly these parables tell us that, despite our sinfulness, in God's eyes we are still the apple of His eyes; that still our names are written on the Palm of His hands. He would still love to gather us under his arms, as would a hen gather her chicks under her wings.


Jesus knew that his friends were not all that holy. But He still loved them. The Pharisees did not consider the less holy people as lovable. Even the less holy people did not consider themselves as lovable or valuable. But Jesus makes it clear that although we may be lost in sin, we could still be his friends; He loves us for what we truly are. That is why even when we were still sinners, Jesus called us His friends and died.

We are reminded that, God desperately wants us back on His side. He cannot accept the fact that any of us would be lost to Him forever. He would even die to get us on to His fold. Therefore, He is overjoyed when anyone repents and turns away from sinful ways. He rejoices over those who had once been lost, but now are found.

We are all like the 20 dollar note, wrinkled and soiled. All of us have experienced being lost, confused and left alone and unwanted. We all have strayed away, for whatever reason, be it due to one's own fault or through others' fault, or for no one's fault. At such times remember the parables of today; and know that, someone is passionately and desperately looking for you and wants you still. That someone is Our God, who brought us to being and knows our true worth.

Our trust is in the God, who seeks the lost, heals the wounded, forgives the offender, and gives hope to those who are in despair. It is in God's nature to save, because it is in His nature to love. Today's Gospel is an invitation for all of us to allow ourselves to be found by God. Therefore, let us call out to Him, that we may be heard and rescued.







The Lord never tires of forgiving, it is we who tire of asking for forgiveness.
