

24th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

This Sunday's Gospel speaks about forgiveness, which is at the heart of Jesus' message. Forgiveness is essential to our relationship with God and with one another.



Every relationship comes with times of friction, misunderstandings, disagreements etc. So we know, no relationship can last without forgiveness. Every married couple, for an example, knows that. The same applies to any relationship, especially between two friends, siblings, co-workers etc. But that does not mean that Forgiveness can stand in the way of 'fraternal correction', which was last Sunday's Gospel message. Forgiveness does not mean putting up with abusive situations, especially when they involve those who are defenceless.

Forgiving those who have hurt us is not easy. The bigger the hurt the more difficult it is to forgive. But how do we forgive? There is only one way: "the Cross". We have to take our anger, our injuries, our hurts to the Cross of Christ. The Cross brings healing because when we stand before the Cross we recognize and acknowledge our guilt. Just know that if you or I were the only person who ever sinned, Jesus would have still died on the Cross to bring us forgiveness. It was our sins that placed Jesus on the Cross. It also means that the forgiveness Jesus brought about through the Cross is so much more greater than our sins.

Another thought that should help us to forgive is to remember that Jesus died to save the other person just as he died to save you and me. Try to visualize that person beneath Jesus on the Cross. Can you see Jesus dying for that person as well? Then why don't we?

Asking for forgiveness is important too. It makes us humble. It's important to be humble enough to admit that 'mistake was mine' please forgive me; rather than 'mistake was yours, but I am good enough to forgive you'. It is very hard to give forgiveness, but it's even harder to ask for forgiveness.

Forgiveness is part and parcel of true love!
