- ◆ Approval Process: The group was reminded that Safeguarding is of utmost importance and that all leaders and coordinators must have a current WWCC, completed the Safeguarding Essentials Training Module and signed the Code of Conduct. Joanna will work with Clara who is on the SA Safeguarding Committee to ensure compliance.
- All ideas and proposals must be submitted to the Parish Office; Communication to applicable Pillar Groups and Coordinators; Feedback from PPC
- ◆ Notice of the Mass and Gathering will be advertised in the Newsletter / Bulletin.

#### Parish Pastoral Council Summery notes

- ◆ 1st meeting of the PPC was held at Parish House on Tuesday, 3rd September lead by Jacqui Giuliano
- ◆ After the initial Prayer and introduction the PPC Charter was ratified.
- ◆ Vision statement (discussed from August 2022 Open Meeting) remains to be finalised.
- ◆ Reviewing, communicating, and selecting Parish Vision to allow targeting of resources.
- ◆ Agreed upon the dates for the next three PPC meetings, i.e. 15 October; 19 November and 18 February (tentatively on 3rd Tuesdays).
- Involvement of Collaborative Council and Parishioners in finalising Parish Ministry Structure under the 5 Pillar System was recognised and appreciated
- ◆ Coordinators of each Pillar Group to allow for ownership and accountability.
- ◆ Communication channels across Pillars needs to be discussed
- ♦ Brief conversation around Models
- ◆ Focus for the PPC strategic / big picture pastoral planning
- ◆ Agenda items to be set and sent out one week prior to next meeting
- ◆ Membership of the PPC was discussed.
- PPC Commissioning Mass to be planned.
- Electing of Chair Person and Secretary could also be held as soon as possible.
- Young Adults Program: Mass to go ahead after checking with concerned Pillar Group and Committees, and after completing all the compliances.
- ◆ Training for Volunteers for Communion to the Sick will be conducted by Fr Pat and team.

Dear brothers and sisters in Jesus,

We know, that the deaf/mute man in today's Gospel was happy, because he was healed; but I believe, he was even happier, because Jesus spoke to him. He was happy that he could now hear and speak, but I think he was happier still, because Jesus touched him.

Learning from the deaf/mute man, let our prayers also be, not that 'Please God touch me so that I may be healed'; but, 'Please God, touch me and speak to me'. Being healed is not what I am really looking for, but a loving relationship with the Lord.

Jesus could have healed the man without touching him at all. But Jesus knew what the man really needed. So, Jesus offered a touch without being asked. We who hear about it or read about it, may feel a bit taken aback. But for the man it must have been a touch of acceptance by the Lord.

Probably, for a very long time he was missing the acceptance of his own community. In his case, we read that he had at least some friends who brought him to Jesus. But we know of many other people who have neither friend, nor relations, but the Lord alone. For them a word or a touch from the Lord would mean a lot.

We can see, we can hear, we can speak, we can walk and more, so, we may think we do not need a touch from the Lord. A touch of the Lord, not so that I may receive this or that. I want a touch from the Lord, not "So that" but "because": because Jesus is my Lord too; because, I too want to feel accepted by the Lord.

"EPHPHATHA!"
"BE OPENED!"

In fact our hearts too need a touch from our God. What a wonderful thing it is to be touched in the heart by God. The touch of God in the heart is an awesome thing. When the heart is touched we are deeply changed. When the heart is touched, the core of our being is touched and we are transformed.
