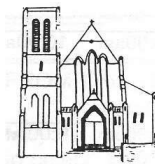

The Precepts of the Church

The Church calls her children to live Catholic life:

- To attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation.
- To confess sins at least once a year.
- To receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least once during the Easter season.
- To observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- To help to provide for the needs of the Church.

*Ephphetha: that is, be opened,
that you may profess the faith you hear,
to the praise and glory of God.*

St Mark says Jesus, "looked up to heaven and groaned, and said, 'Ephphetha!' (that is, 'Be opened!')."

"Ephphetha" is an Aramaic word that the evangelist has preserved as we would do with a ritual or sacred formula that has meaning for its readers. In fact, for a long time, it was used, just as it is, in the baptismal liturgy. Besides, this word proves to be immediately effective. This healing of a nameless deaf-mute man seems to be a parable for the cure of another deafness and of another speech impediment that only grace can heal...God has placed the profession of faith in our mouths.
