Parish Stewardship Renewal 2018 Update

A warm welcome to 27 new families who have joined our Parish Stewardship! In coming days, contact will be made with all who completed a Parish Census card a month or so ago. We will then be able to give a full account of our Parish Stewardship Renewal, and the confidence it gives us in moving ahead with parish life, worship, service and outreach. We have also received a number of groups and ministries forms from parishioners willing to be active in parish life and mission.

Please note that your new pledge will take effect from Sunday 7 October. Letters of confirmation and new sets of envelopes will be available for collection at all Masses weekend 29-30 September.

Many parishioners have also made a generous pledge to support priests in the Presbytery collection. It's worth remembering that the Presbytery collection supports our own Parish Priest (stipend, living and food expenses, housekeeping, annual leave), as well as sick and retired priests (12.5%), priests in needy parishes (12.5%), and our bishops (5%).

Parish Stewardship supports our parish, as well as meeting major yearly expenses: insurance (\$8,500), rates (\$4,500), utilities (\$33,000), bus (\$2,832). Each Melbourne parish also supports the agencies, offices and outreach of the diocese: our annual diocesan levy is \$26,700.

A new Parish Finance Committee will soon be established to oversee parish accounts, promote parish stewardship, and prepare an annual finance report to parishioners. A parish maintenance programme and budget must be established, and our income and expenditure constantly reviewed.

Rejoice and be Glad (Mt 5:12)

Those who really wish to give glory to God by their lives, who truly long to grow in holiness, are called to be single-minded and tenacious in their practice of the works of mercy. Saint Teresa of Calcutta clearly realized this: "Yes, I have many human faults and failures... but God bends down and uses us, you and me, to be his love and his compassion in the world; he bears our sins, our troubles and our faults.
