*Blessed are the peacemakers,  
 for they will be called children of God*

Peacemakers truly "make" peace; they build peace and  
 friendship in society. To those who sow peace Jesus  
 makes this magnificent promise: "They will be called  
 children of God" (Mt 5:9). He told his disciples that,  
 wherever they went, they were to say: "Peace to this  
 house!" (Lk 10:5). The word of God exhorts every believer  
 to work for peace, "along with all who call upon the Lord  
 with a pure heart" (cf. 2 Tim 2:22), for "the harvest of  
 righteousness is sown in peace by those who make peace"  
 (Jas 3:18). And if there are times in our community when  
 we question what ought to be done, "let us pursue what  
 makes for peace" (Rom 14:19), for unity is preferable to  
 conflict.

It is not easy to "make" this evangelical peace, which  
 excludes no one but embraces even those who are a bit  
 odd, troublesome or difficult, demanding, different, beaten  
 down by life or simply uninterested. It is hard work; it calls  
 for great openness of mind and heart, since it is not about  
 creating "a consensus on paper or a transient peace for a  
 contented minority", or a project "by a few for the few". Nor  
 can it attempt to ignore or disregard conflict; instead, it  
 must "face conflict head on, resolve it and make it a link in  
 the chain of a new process". We need to be artisans of  
 peace, for building peace is a craft that demands serenity,  
 creativity, sensitivity and skill.

Sowing peace all around us: that is holiness
