I remember well receiving my darling daughter Niamh's diagnosis on the 27th of July 2017. The fear on hearing those horrible words in regards to GM1 Gangliosidosis, and what that meant for Niamh broke my heart.

I'll admit that I did a whole lot of feeling sorry for MYSELF. "What did I do so wrong that my daughter would be inflicted with this horrible disease?", "Why me?" and "Did I do something I shouldn't have during pregnancy to cause this?". The stages of grief – anger and guilt – were causing issues to my mental health.

This self-pity only made me feel worse, and was definitely not helpful in caring for Niamh.

Talking things over with a professional did help, giving me perspective on why I was feeling this way, and steps to put into place to move forward. My sisters and their families also supported me, and still do, alleviating the sense of loneliness, and at times isolation, in raising a child with disabilities.

The source of fortitude I found through prayer provided me with further courage and strength, helping me to see the happiness in nurturing Niamh and ensuring that her life is filled with joy. That her needs are not only met but exceeded and that she is happy and well loved.

Through my involvement in various support groups, I know parents of children with disabilities and life limiting conditions struggle with blame, depression and pre-emptive grief. Though destructive, my belief is that these things need to be felt in order for a person to move forward, to see the blessings in their special little person and to celebrate their child.

I know that Niamh has made me a better person.

"Parenthood is about raising and celebrating the child you have, not the child you thought you'd have. It's about understanding your child is exactly the person they are supposed to be. And, if you're lucky, they might be the teacher who turns you into the person you're supposed to be" Joan Ryan (The Water Giver)
