A RARE DISEASE JOURNEY—NIAMH AND MAREE DALTON

Weeks of Lent Themes – Week 1 – Temptation, Confession, vigilance, God's promises

My beautiful daughter and only child Niamh (pronounced Neeve) was born at 3:24am on the 16th of May 2007. I drove myself to Casey hospital, arriving at 3:00am and Niamh arrived very soon after, prior to my sister and support person making it! Niamh's father and I had separated prior to my finding out that I was pregnant and I remember the fear I felt as a lay in bed at night prior to her birth – how was I going to do this? How would I look after my child and work to support us both? I prayed and had conversations with God. Physically, I had a trouble-free pregnancy, with no medical issues at all. The minute I held Niamh in my arms all my fears disappeared. I had a healthy baby and we would make life work.

Niamh was baptised on the 2nd of September 2007 at Our Lady Help of Christians in Narre Warren, a joyous occasion for our extended family.

I chose Maree as her Baptismal name.

Niamh is an Irish Gaelic name and means brightness and radiance, traits clearly evident in Niamh with her red hair and sparkly blue eyes. Niamh was a wonderful baby, a good sleeper and eater, and she hit all the milestones in the blue maternal health care book right up until the age of 2 – crawling, babbling, talking, walking, fine and gross motor skills etc.

Niamh started having epileptic seizures at about age 2, starting with absence seizures, which saw her gazing into space, followed by drop seizures, causing her to fall to the floor. There was no warning when a seizure occurred. Our GP referred us to a Paediatrician who in turn sent us off to a Neurologist. Metabolic specialists also

became involved. A barrage of testing then occurred in order to try and identify what was occurring in Niamh. Tests for known epileptic disorders such as Dravet's Syndrome & Lennox Gastaut all returned negative results, as did those for Huntington's Disease, Autism and ADHD to name just a few. And let me tell you, Doctor Google is not your friend when attempting to work out medical issues!

We spent many weeks in Hospitals, both the Children's and the

Austin. An example of testing included 5 days of EEG monitoring on Niamh's brain, with video recording of seizures as they occurred. I stayed with Niamh for the 5 days, and every time I thought

she was having a seizure, I had to press a button to record this. The room lights were on and bright 24/7, and as you can imagine, the sleep deprivation, coupled with the anxiety of what I would find out about my darling girl, ensured I was an emotional wreck by the end of the week. Results? Yes, she is having seizures. Why? We don't know.

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I live with my sister Jane, her husband Mark and their son Sebastian who have proven to be our rocks, caring for Niamh as if she was their own. Jane often "jokes" – "you can leave anytime Maree, but Niamh stays with us". The photo here is just after Niamh turned 2, and the 5 of us went to Fiji for a family holiday. It was at about this time that the seizures started and our world would be turned upside.
